### Subject

Approve an ordinance authorizing acceptance of \$3,444 in grant funds from the Texas Historical Commission and amending the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Planning and Development Review Department Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund (Ordinance No. 20130909-001) to appropriate funds for rehabilitating the roof on a historic building in the City's Oakwood Cemetery Annex.

## Amount and Source of Funding

The total additional grant amount of \$3,443.75 will be provided from FY 2012 Certified Local Government funds from the Texas Historical Commission.

### Additional Backup Information

The City's Historic Preservation Office was awarded a Fiscal Year 2012 Certified Local Government (CLG) grant from the Texas Historical Commission (THC) in the amount of \$7,600.00. That grant provided funding toward the rehabilitation of the roof on a historic building in the City of Austin's Oakwood Cemetery Annex. The Cemetery Annex is a City of Austin Historic Landmark, and is a contributing building in the Oakwood Cemetery Annex National Register Historic District.

The project was a joint effort between the City of Austin's Historic Preservation Office, the Parks & Recreation Department (PARD) and Save Austin's Cemeteries (SAC), a local non-profit 501(c)3 group that assists the City in preserving the history and features of Austin's cemeteries. SAC and PARD provided in-kind and cash contributions toward the rehabilitation.

CLG grants provide funding from the National Park Service to participating city and county governments to develop and sustain effective local preservation programs critical to preserving local historic resources. The additional grant funds are being allocated by the THC to cover the City's previously unreimbursed expenses (e.g. cash over-match) to complete this grant-funded project.
