MOBILE HOME PARK: We have acquired all thirty-eight (38) homes. Of the thirty-eight (38) acquired homes, three (3) are occupied and thirty-five (35) have been vacated. We are assisting the families in the three (3) occupied homes with obtaining replacement housing. Asbestos abatement and demolition have been completed on thirty-three (33) of the vacated mobile homes. We are waiting on asbestos results before scheduling the next round of abatement and demolition. We have utilized the SH71 Partners escrow account to help relocate four (4) families, but one (1) of the families repaid the escrow funds that were used to assist them. At this time, we do not anticipate needing the escrow fund for any additional families. However, the remaining escrow funds will be released only after the last family has relocated.

LAND EXCHANGE: The Airport plans to dispose of the Mobile Home Park and vacant lot located on Shapard Lane by Land Exchange. We are in the process of obtaining approval from the FAA for the

exchange.

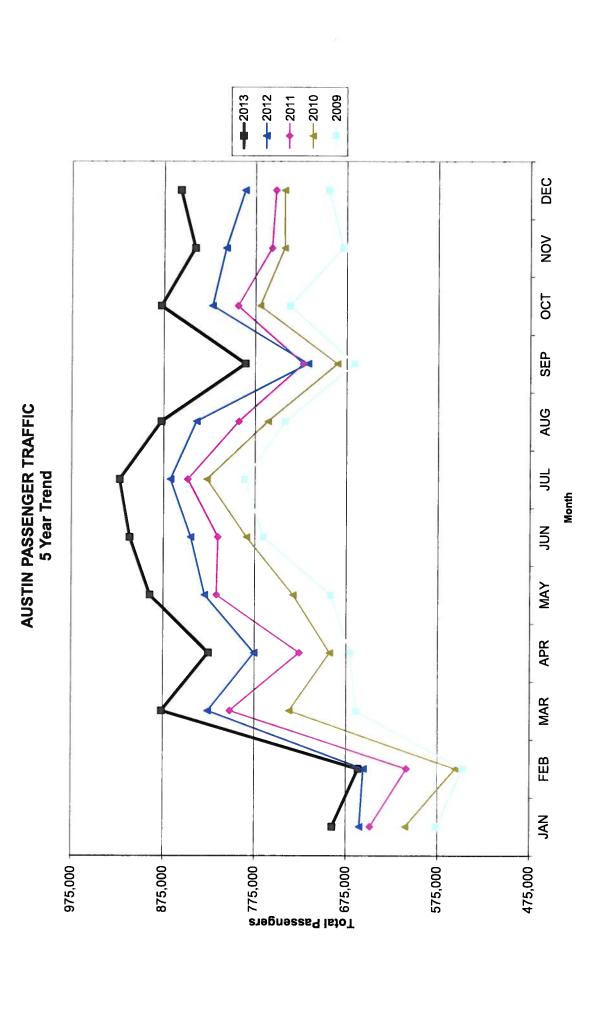

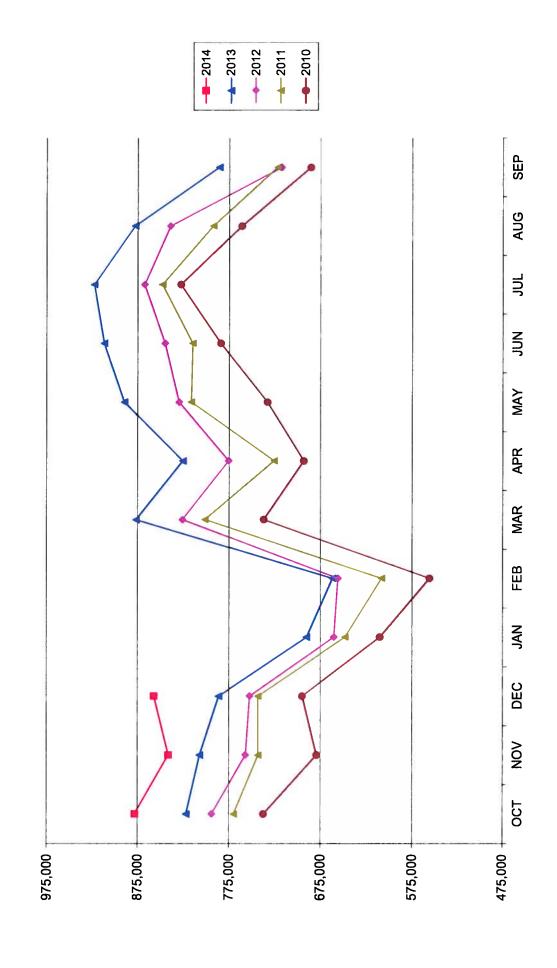

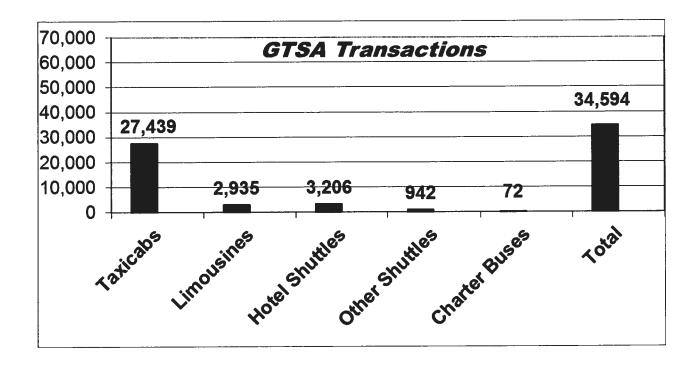

# Additional Backup Information

Taxiway A is parallel to one of the two main runways at the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (ABIA). Taxiway A has been constructed in phases, with the most recent expansion project being completed in 2002. The taxiway is currently considered a partial parallel taxiway because it does not extend the entire length of the main runway.

This project will complete Taxiway A by constructing the remaining portions to the south and the north. The completion of Taxiway A as a full length parallel taxiway, along with the existing Taxiway B, will provide multiple access points to the main runway, thus allowing air traffic control options in handling high density traffic. The scope of work for Taxiway A completion includes construction of 75-foot wide concrete taxiway pavement, construction of 30-foot wide hot mix asphalt concrete (HMAC) pavement shoulders, and installation of a pavement under-drain

system, airfield centerline, taxiway lights and guidance signs. The bid documents included two alternate bid items to allow for constructing the north and south shoulders to 30 feet wide.

Timely construction completion is particularly important for this project in order to minimize impact to the airport's airfield operations. A 10% contingency in funding has been included to allow for the expeditious processing of any change orders.

The contract allows 250 calendar days for completion of this project. This project is located within zip code 78719 and is managed by the Public Works Department.

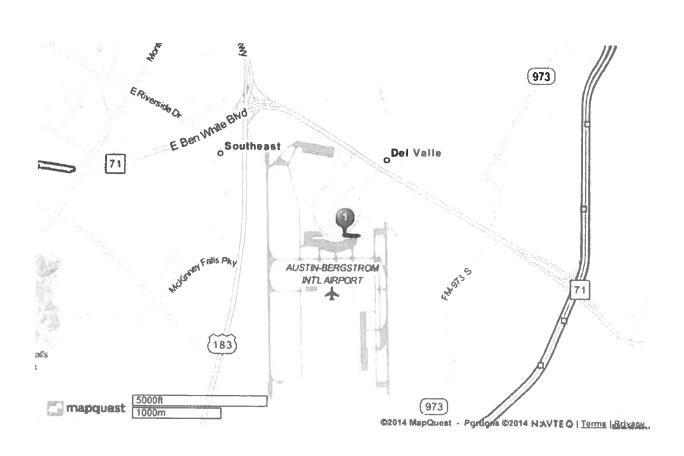

#### Additional Backup Information

On September 3, 2013, British Airways announced new, nonstop service between London and Austin beginning March 3, 2014. The flight will connect Heathrow and Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (Airport) and marks the first regular transatlantic air service for the City of Austin.

The flights will be operated on a Boeing 787 Dreamliner aircraft five days a week, increasing to daily flights starting in May.

The London-Heathrow nonstop route will have an initial economic impact of \$69.7 million the first year, and is

expected to grow to \$74 million annually within three years. Additionally, the economic impact analysis estimates 65 direct jobs will be created in the first year, increasing to 83 total direct jobs by year three.

The agreement to begin service between London and Austin was brought about by collaboration between Airport and the City of Austin Economic Development Department in addition to the substantial passenger base of both business and leisure travelers that exists between the two cities. In accordance with the Airport's domestic and international air service recruitment program, qualifying carriers providing new qualifying service to international destinations may be offered marketing assistance. Additionally, the City and Airport's partnerships with local travel, tourism, and business entities committed to support the new international nonstop route.

Common practice in the United States passenger air transportation industry is that the airport and city benefiting from new international routes provide marketing and promotional support to ensure the success of the new route. In accordance with federal statutes and Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) policy, airport revenue may be used to cover a share of promotional expenses such as marketing and advertising to increase travel and promote new service. However, FAA's policy requires the City to pay marketing and advertising costs directly to the vendors providing the service.

The Department of Aviation and the Economic Development Department request authorization to continue to partner with British Airways to promote and ensure the success of the London/Austin route by providing marketing and promotional support for two years. Funding for marketing and promotion will be provided as follows:

# Additional Backup Information

**Austin Air Cargo One, LLC** ("*Tenant*") currently leases from the City of Austin, 731,830 square feet of land on which they built 3 cargo buildings (the "*Improvements*") pursuant to the First Amended and Restated Agreement for Private Development and Operation of an Air Freight and Cargo Facility at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport dated September 25, 1996, as amended, (collectively, the "*Ground Lease*). The construction of the Improvements was financed by the issuance of bonds by ABIA Development Corporation. The Ground Lease with Tenant expires 5/30/2025.

As part of a debt refinancing and restructuring arrangement, the Tenant proposes to pay off all the outstanding bonds and assign the lease to **Lynxs Austin Cargoport**, **LLC** ("New Tenant"). Once assigned, the Ground Lease would be terminated. Simultaneously with the termination a new lease will be entered into between the City and the New Tenant. The New Tenant is owned in part by a former affiliate of the

Tenant and who originally constructed the Improvements and currently manage the Improvements. In considers for the City's consent and approval to the refinancing and restructuring, the New Tenant will pay the City a one-time fee of \$150,000, reimburse the City for financial and legal fees capped at \$10,000 and \$15,000 respectively, and increase ground rent by \$.025 PSFA. The lease with the New Tenant will expire in 2040 (an additional 15 years from the original termination) in order for the New Tenant to obtain financing and amortize their investment.,
