- 2. OLD BUSINESS: For discussion and possible action The Committee discussed the agenda for the upcoming December 16 Work session Meeting. Commissioner Ron Lucey recommended some changes to the agenda. Cand committee liaison Dolores Gonzalez, said that she willould send last year's annual report for commissioners to review.
- 3. NEW BUSINESS: For Discussion and possible action

Presentation: Linda Espy, Program Manager, Workbase Learning Program. Providing an update report on the Workbase Learning Program and services provided to youth with disabilities, including number of youth served and other relevant data.

- New Program Leadership Academy
 - <u>DThis program is no longer a pilot, but a full fledge d</u>ue to its success, it is now an integral part of the entire program.
 - Approximately, round-35 youths participated in <u>various sessions sessions</u>
 concentrating on <u>leadership skillsthat the program offered</u> including: <u>a program like the show Apprenticeapprenticing</u>, <u>dangers of</u> bullying, and a store project where the youths were <u>to manage a store withgiven some</u> cash handling roles. <u>The final was a competitive marketing project that included all members and was judged by community leaders.</u>
 - The program also offers a session on community service; this year, the class donated \$250, was donated to a ssoup kkitchen.
- If the committee would like to see more youth in the program, Linda Espy discussed with the committee the need for increaseing staff to manage that growth.
- if the committee. Commissioner Ron Lucey commended Linda on the program, and asked where the jJob coaches came from? To which Linda confirmed that the majority majority of the job coaches came from Goodwill Industries.
- Also discussed, was a request from Linda for additional funding: she did mention that the program, Linda will get an additional \$73,000 from the City, but would like to see an even bigger increase.

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- Commissioner <u>Adam</u> Slosberg asked Linda what types of disabilities were represented through the youths in theory program. Linda responded that disabilities <u>served</u> in the program included: Down-Syndrome, Autism, <u>B</u>bi-polar <u>disorder</u>, Tourette's syndrome and various learning disabilities.
- Commissioner Lucey suggested that Linda go to the Employment and Accesses Awards History of Winners respective links on the AMCPD homepage forte find additional placement sites.
- Vice Chair, TanyaCommissioner Winters said she would provide information to Constable Carlos Lopez Precinct #5, for job placement. Commissioner Winters also suggested contacting service providers to people with disabilities such as the DARS transition program; Commissioner Lucey said he would also follow up on this.
- Commissioner Kathy Keller added that she would send Linda the DMD Mentor List once it was updated for additional job placement sites. Commissioner Ron Lucey stated the committee was gearing up for their annual work session, where the job placement and Workbase Learning Program would be addressedbrought up.
