PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1934 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with a front-gabled hood over the entry; 1:1 fenestration.

RESEARCH


The house was built in 1934 by Olin G. Humphries and his wife, Bess. Olin Humphries was a linotype operator and worked in printing shops for most of his career. The Humphries family lived here until around 1938. The house was then a rental property until the mid-1940s. Among the renters was DeWitt C. Reddick, an associate professor at the University of Texas, who lived here from around 1940 to around 1942; his later home in Pemberton Heights is now a designated City historic landmark. Mary Winton, a Missouri-born widow who had lived in Waco for most of her life owned the house through the early 1950s. The house then had a series of short-term owners and renters, and has been a rental property since the 1980s.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin documentation package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Olin G. and Bess Humphries (ca. 1934 – ca. 1938) Olin G. and Bess Humphries appear in the 1940 U.S. Census as the owners of the house at 813 W. James Street in Austin; the house was worth \$2,100. Olin G. Humphries was then 46, had been born in Texas, and was a printer at a printing company. Bess Humphries was then 39, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had two children: Olin, Jr., 14; and Bob Gregg, 9. Both boys had been born in Texas and neither had an occupation listed.



Humphries died in a local hospital Wednesday. He was a retired printer for the Nelson Type-setting Service and had been a printer for over 50 years. He was a member of the Northwest Baptist Church, the Austin Typographical Union and Hill City Lodge No. 456 A.F. & A.M.; a veteran of World War 1 and a resident of Austin for 53 years.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Bess Humphries of Austin; two sons, Olin G. Humphries Jr. of Houston and Bob Humphries of Austin; four brothers, John Humphries and Charles Humphries, both of Houston, Jess Humphries of Liberty Hill and Benny Humphries of Aransas Pass; two sisters, Mrs. Velma Whited of Liberty Hill and Mrs. Agnes Allgood of Port Arthur; and two grandsons, Sandy Humphries and Bobby Humphries.




