PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1950 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, wing-and-gable plan, frame house with a partial-width inset porch on turned wood posts; tri-partite picture window in the front wall shaded by the porch, otherwise single 2:2 horizontally-configured fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1950 by the Capitol City Lumber Company. The first owners and occupants were F. Harrell "Mac" McFarland and his wife, Lucille, who lived here until around 1970. Mac McFarland was the chief clerk for the Adjutant General's Department and spent his working life in that office. After the McFarland family moved out, the house was a rental property in the 1980s and 1990s.


STAFF COMMENTS

STAFF RECOMMENDATION



BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

F. Harrell and Lucille T. McFarland (ca. 1951 – ca. 1970)

The 1940 U.S. Census shows Harold [sic] McFarland as the 18-year old son of F. Harrell and Ruth McFarland, who lived at 3903 Avenue B in Austin. All family members had been born in Texas. F. H. McFarland was the owner of a garage; Harold had no occupation listed. The 1930 U.S. Census shows the family in the same house on Avenue B; F. Harrell McFarland is listed as a garage owner.

Colonel Frank Harrell "Mac" McFarland, U.S. Army, Retired

Land, U.S. Army, Retired, died Wednesday, July 12, 1995.

Colonel McFarland was a member of the Texas National Guard, mobilized in 1940, served as a member of the 36th Division. After World War II, he to turned to the Texas National Guard as a full-time member and employee of the Adjutant General's Department. He was serving as President of the Board of the Texas Military Forces Museum at Camp Mabry.

Mac will be remembered fondly by his family and many friends.

He is survived by his two daughters

and their families, Mary and Baker Montgomery and their children, Ann, Joan, Ben and Jeff; Bonnie and Patrick Wiseman and their children, James and Clare; and his long-time friend and companion, Madge Pierson.

Graveside services will be held at 11:00 a.m. Saturday at Austin Memorial Park.
