PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1934 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled Cumberland-style frame house with double front doors, a full-width front-gabled inset porch on round metal pipe posts; single 4:4 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built (like the house next door at 814 W. James, the subject of a demolition permit application last month) in 1934 as a rental property. The earliest known tenants of the house were M. Kaufman and Eula Joslin, who lived here from around 1934 to around 1936; Joslin had no occupation listed in the 1935 city directory, but by 1940, was a night watchman for a printing company, according to the census of that year. In the late 1930s, the house was rented by Raymond C. and Annie Shuler; Raymond Shuler was an operator for the Texas Public Service Company; the 1940 U.S. Census, which shows him and his family living in a rented house on Roosevelt, listed him as an operating engineer for an ice factory. Since around 1940, the house has been a rental property with a wide variety of short-term tenants, including an auto parts store manager, a photo engraver, a carpenter, several plumbers, and a construction worker.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation of the house if possible; this is one of a diminishing number of Cumberland-style houses remaining in the city, and should be preserved and adaptively reused if possible. If rehabilitation and re-use is not possible, then staff encourages relocation over demolition, but in either case, release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

M. Kaufman and Eula Joslin (ca. 1934 – ca. 1936)

M. Kaufman and Eula L. Joslin appear in the 1940 U.S. Census as the renters of the house at 705 W. 32nd Street in Austin. M. Kaufman Joslin was then 59, had been born in Texas, and was the night watchman for a wholesale and retail printing company. Eula Joslin was then 52, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had 2 sons: Vernon, 17, and Ross, 30 with his wife, Julia, 24, and their 2 children, Jerry, 5, and Ross, 4. Ross Joslin was a truck driver for a wholesale printing company. They also had a boarder, Claude Bendetti, a carpenter, who had lived in Bexar County in 1935.

Raymond and Annie Shuler (ca. 1936 – ca. 1940)

Raymond and Annie Shuler appear in the 1940 U.S. Census as the renters of a house at 5610 Roosevelt Avenue in Austin. Raymond Shuler was then 35, had been born in Texas, and was an operating engineer at an ice factory. Annie Shuler was then 34, had been born in Texas,

and had no occupation listed. They had 4 children: Ida, 15; Christine, 14; Raymond, 13; and Joyce, 7. All the children had been born in Texas.
