Subject

Authorize award and execution of a 36-month requirements service contract with TEXAS DISPOSAL SYSTEMS, INC., or one of the other qualified bidders for IFB-BV No. JRD0100, to provide refuse and recycling collection and hauling services within the Downtown Central Business District of Austin in an amount not to exceed \$6,234,879, with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$2,078,293 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$12,469,758.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$692,765 is available in the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Operating Budget of the Austin Resource Recovery Department. Funding for the remaining thirty-one months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

Additional Backup Information

This contract will provide for daily refuse and recycling services in the alleys of the Downtown Central Business District. In addition to refuse and recycling collection, this contract will provide services for cleaning and maintenance of all the alleys in the service district. This contract will cover additional collection needs for special events held in the Downtown Central Business District.

The Austin Resource Recovery Department does not provide these services because they do not have the type of equipment that is required. They do, however, manage this contract. The majority of refuse and recycling containers

will be serviced on a daily basis. A provision of this contract allows for containers to be added or removed as downtown business requirements change.

This request allows for the execution of a contract with a bidder, who provides the best value to the City, that Council selects. If this bidder does not execute a contract with the City, staff will return to Council so that Council may select another best value bidder and authorize a contract with that bidder.

PRICE ANALYSIS

- a. Adequate competition.
- b. 542 notices were sent, including 72 MBEs and 6 WBEs. Two bids were received with no MBEs/WBEs responding.
- c. The pricing offered represents a 66% increase to the last purchase made. Factors affecting the price increase are attributed to a 7% increase in the Consumer Price Index for Garbage and Refuse Collections, 6% increase in the Consumer Price Index for Motor Fuels, 8% increase in the Consumer Price Index for Garbage and Refuse Collections Wages, increased requirements to maintain the contract, and additional measures taken to meet a Zero Waste Initiative reporting requirements.
