

On your April 8, 2014 agenda is a request for approval of a shoreline modification to allow the construction of a bulkhead along Lake Austin. Because of recent changes to the approval process of shoreline modifications, the Planning Commission is the responsible entity to grant approvals of all proposed shoreline modifications along Lake Austin (reference LDC 25-8-652(C)). According to this section of the LDC, the Planning Commission shall review and comment on:

- (a) the navigational safety of the proposed development; and
- (b) the effect of the development on the recreational and natural character of the lake.

Description of Property

The proposed site plan consists of two platted residential lots with the same owner. The site is located in the Lake Austin Watershed, which is classified as Water Supply Rural and located in the Drinking Water Protection Zone. The site is not located over the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone. The subdivision (Cliff Over Lake Austin II) was recorded in September, 1980. The entire site is located within the Full Purpose Zoning Jurisdiction and is zoned LA. According to TCAD records, the two single family residences were constructed in 1987 and 1995.

Description of Project

The proposed project consists of shoreline restoration and construction of a stone bulkhead. In October of 2012, City of Austin Environmental Inspections staff issued a Stop Work Order related to unpermitted fill that had been placed in the lake, an unpermitted floating dock and the addition of stacked stone along the shoreline and partial clearing of shoreline vegetation. The owner has agreed to remove the fill, remove the floating dock and restore the shoreline as shown on the proposed site plan. The proposed restoration will remove the unpermitted fill and will restore the location of the shoreline back to the original location, thereby removing all unpermitted land capture. In addition, the applicant has proposed a code-compliant stone bulkhead along the shoreline. The bulkhead is considered to be a shoreline modification.

Recommendation

Staff recommends approval of this project.
