# Motion to recommend approval of consent agenda Items 2-6 (Metzger); seconded (Krishna); passed on vote of 4-0.

- 2. Authorize award and execution of a 12-month supply requirements contract with NIAGARA CONSERVATION, for the purchasing of high efficiency bathroom and kitchen faucet aerators and showerheads for the Austin Water Utility in an amount not to exceed \$32,550, with two 12-month extension options in amounts not to exceed \$32,550 per extension option, for a total contract amount of \$97,650.
- 3. Approve issuance of a rebate to Seton Healthcare for the installation of energy efficient equipment at its facility, Seton Medical Center Austin, 1201 West 38th Street, Austin, Texas 78705, in an amount not to exceed \$70,029.
- 4. Authorize negotiation and execution of an agreement with Cinemark USA Inc., to provide a performance-based incentive for the generation of solar energy at its facility located at 9900 South IH 35, Austin, Texas 78748, for an estimated \$35,821 per year, for a total amount not to exceed \$358,210 over a 10-year period.
- 5. Authorize negotiation and execution of an agreement with Congregation Beth Israel, to provide a performance-based incentive for the generation of solar energy at its facility located at 3901 Shoal Creek Blvd., Austin, Texas 78756, for an estimated \$6,309 per year, for a total amount not to exceed \$63,090 over a 10-year period.
- 6. Authorize negotiation and execution of an agreement with Whole Foods Market, to provide a performance-based incentive for the generation of solar energy at its facility located at 11920 Domain Drive, Austin, Texas 78758, for an estimated \$31,172 per year, for a total amount not to exceed \$311,720 over a 10-year period.
