Bond Development Process

October 2011 - City Council resolution to develop general obligation bond package recommendations.

February 2012 - \$1.5 Billion in projects identified by City Departments

- <u>PARD</u> identified <u>\$9 million</u> for a new Montopolis Recreation Center;
- <u>HHSD</u> identified <u>\$8.45 million</u> for a new Neighborhood Center at Betty Dunkerley Campus.
- April 17, 2012 PARD and HHSD present combined project to BEATF Parks and Open Spaces Committee
 - Committee approves combining of projects -Savings of <u>\$1.95</u> <u>million</u>

Bond Development Process, cont.

- June-Aug 2012 BEATF meetings, Community Workshops, Council Meetings, and Public Hearings held on Bond Package
 - Montopolis Joint Project specifically discussed by City Council in Open Meeting on June 26, August 7, August 15
 - **Nov 2012** \$15.5 million Montopolis Recreation and Community Center Project funded in 2012 Bond propositions
 - Proposition 14 (Parks and Recreation) allocates \$11.78 million
 - <u>Proposition 17</u> (Health and Human Services) allocates \$3.72 million

Project Development Progress


- Project Objective Provide a new and improved recreation and community center to the residents of the Montopolis neighborhood and citizens of Austin (estimated 33,297 square feet)
- Preliminary Conceptual Phase began April 2013
- Preliminary Phase Community Engagement November 2013-May 2014
 - 4 Community Open House Events
 - 4th Open House Date TBD
 - 3 requested stakeholder meetings

Public Proposed Services

- Continuation of all Current Recreational Activities
- Commercial Kitchen
- Special Events Space and Meeting Rooms
- Senior Activities
- Full Service Neighborhood Center for Basic Needs
- Continuing Education Services
- Early Childhood Activities
- Sports
- Exercise and Fitness
- Women, Infant and Children (WIC) Health and Wellness Activities

Community Concerns

- Planning for sufficient parking
- Influx of citizens from other neighborhoods to this facility
- Size and services of the recreation center not being sufficient
- Proposed building footprint too large to allow for future expansion of the recreation center and other outdoor amenities on this site
- Perception that HHSD locating administration and not program staff at the Montopolis facility
- Availability of other locations for the HHSD services



Project Timeline

- Preliminary Phase May 2014
- community input, list of services and space requirements, site study.
- Selection of Design Consultant firm December 2014
- Request for Qualifications (RFQ) process
- Design and Permitting February 2016
- Conducted by the Consultant, approved by the Council.
- Community Engagement
- Site plan approved by the Planning Commission.
- Bid and Award of Construction Contract October 2016
- Construction completion by December 2017
