PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1953 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, L-plan, hipped and gabled roofed frame house with stone wainscoting; single 1:1, 2:2 and a corner picture window with single-light casements; partial-width roof overhang provides shelter for the principal entry.

RESEARCH

The house was built during the winter of 1952-1953 for Ray C. Burns and his wife, Esther, who lived here until around 1972. Ray and Esther Burns moved into this house from rural Travis County; he was an insurance agent who then operated laundromats in the late 1950s and early 1960s. He later went into cable television sales in the late 1960s. The house was a rental unit through most of the 1970s; Jerry Pulley, a carpenter who then became manager of the Tree Clinic, was the owner and occupant of the house from the early 1980s through the 1990s.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Strongly encourage the applicant to consider rehabilitating the house rather than demolishing it. The house represents a transition between the minimal traditional houses of the late 1940s and mid-century Modern ideas of the early 1950s, especially with its large expanses of glass on the corner with the casement windows. If the applicant pursues demolition, then staff recommends release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. While the house has significant architectural interest, it does not appear to have sufficient historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

Ray C. and Esther Burns (ca. 1952 – ca. 1972) Ray and Esther Burns appear in the 1940 U.S. Census as the owners of the house at 4506 Avenue F in Austin; the house was worth \$3,150. Ray Burns was then 26, had been born in Texas, and was a truck driver for the County. Esther Burns was then 25, had been born in

Texas, and was a typist in the car license department. They had 2 children: Kenneth, 5; and Eleanor, 1.

Ray C. Burns, age 84 of Austin, passed away Sunday, December 21, 1997.

Ray was born July 10, 1913 in Ledbetter. Texas to Clint and Tisha Burns. His mother died when he was 5 and he was reared by his loving Grandmother Burns. He came to Austin in 1926 and married Esther Douglas Hughes in 1933. Mr. Burns was a charter member of Southwest Christian Church, instrumental in starting the 969 Volunteer Fire Department.
