PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1946 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, L-plan, solid brick house with a hipped roof and wraparound ledge; single and paired 1:1 fenestration.

RESEARCH


The house was built in 1946 by Ollie E. and Lena Bybee, who moved here from their home on Palma Plaza. Ollie Bybee was a druggist, who later went to work at the Davis Tavern on E. 6th Street, and became a substation manager for Capitol Laundry and Cleaning. Lena Bybee died in 1952; Ollie Bybee moved out of the house shortly thereafter. In the 1950s, the house was then owned and occupied by Joseph A. and Ruth Hannan; he worked for Mutual Savings Institution. After his death, Ruth continued to live in the house until around 1960. From then on, the house was owned by Thomas W. and Gerda McKern. Tom McKern was a native of Canada, and grew up in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where his father was an anthropologist for a museum. Tom became a professor of anthropology at the University of Texas, divorced Gerda in Las Vegas in 1968, and died in Canada in 1974. Gerda McKern continued to live in the house; she was an administrative assistant for the University of Texas.

STAFF COMMENTS


The house is beyond the bounds of any City survey.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Ollie E. and Lena Bybee (ca. 1946 – ca. 1953)

Ollie and Lena Bybee appear in the 1940 U.S. Census as the owners of the house at 1625 Palma Plaza, which was worth \$6,000. Ollie Bybee was then 55, had been born in Arkansas, and had no occupation listed. Lena Bybee was then 53, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a son, Frank, 35, who was the manager of Bybee's Drug Store. In addition, Lena's sister, Bess Oliver, a 40-year old Texas-born stenographer for railroad attorneys, lived with them. In 1930, according to the U.S. Census report, Ollie and Lena Bybee were living in Mexia, Texas, where Ollie was a radio dealer. They had no children living with them.

Lena Bybee died in 1952; Ollie E. Bybee died in Austin July 29, 1970, but there was no obituary in the Austin newspapers.

Thomas W. and Gerda McKern (ca. 1960 -)

Thomas W. McKern appears as the 9-year old son of Will and Clara McKern of Milwaukee, Wisconsin in the 1930 U.S. Census. Will McKern had been born in Washington, and was the curator of a public museum. Thomas W. McKern was the oldest of their 2 children. He had been born in British Columbia, Canada. The 1940 U.S. Census shows 19-year old Tom McKern living with his parents in Milwaukee; he had no occupation listed, but his father was a museum anthropologist. Tom McKern died in New Westminster, British Columbia September 13, 1974.

Thomas and Gerda McKern were divorced in Clark County (Las Vegas), Nevada June 3, 1968.



Gerda Marie Furumo "Jeff" McKern Gerda Marie Furumo "Jeff" McKern died February 14th, 2013 of old age. Born in Appleton, Wisconsin in 1920, one of five children, all deceased; Torsten, Joan, Norbert and Jackson. She left lots of Nephews and Nieces, Friends and Children; Scott, Patrick and Joan, 2 Great Daughters-in-Law; Lynn and Leah. After Wisconsin, California and the East Coast, she and her family settled in Austin, Texas in 1958. As a faculty wife (her husband taught Anthropology at U.T.), she was very involved with the International Hospitality House, who hosted many foreign students in her home. Also, a prominent member of the Pan American Round Table and the Zilker Garden Club. She worked for 20 years at the College of Education at U.T., she had a great love for life(a cancer survivor of 50 years) and everything was an adventure. Her love of travel took her the Pyramids of Mexico, sunset at the northern Grand Canyon, cross-country skiing at the base of the Teton Mountains, sand storms in Colorado, 'Fire Fall" in Yosemite, the museums of Europe, beachcombing and birding on the Texas Coast. Her house was open to all, her livingroom, an open forum for discussion, ideas, food and drink. A great swimmer, photographer and reader, challenging, witty funny, liberal, difficult, an optimist. She will be missed. Our thanks to Dr. mark Levy, Dr. Terreson and Darby, the great folks at Grace Hospice of Austin, Sara Jo, Kathleen and the Tucker family.
