# HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION APRIL 28, 2014 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2014-0248 1120 FAIRMOUNT AVENUE

## PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1948 house.

### ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, front-gabled, concrete block house with a partial-width, shedroofed, independent porch on ornamental metal posts; metal-framed multi-light casement windows; vertical board veneer at the tympanum of the front gable.

### RESEARCH

The house was built in 1948 for Isaac N. and Margaret Mayfield. Isaac Mayfield was an engineer for the Portland Cement Association; he was the son of an attorney in Giddings, Texas, and had spent time in the CCC Camp in Yoakum in the early 1940s. He and Margaret lived here until around 1953. At the time of Margaret's death in 2006, she was living in Plano. Both Isaac and Margaret are buried in Giddings. The house was then rented for many years by Ernest and Ruby R. Christian. Ernest Christian was a cattle rancher from DeWitt County; Ruby Christian had been a school teacher in DeWitt County before moving to Austin. While renting this house, Ernest Christian listed himself either as a rancher or as a livestock dealer in the city directories. They lived here until Ernest's death in 1986. The house has continued to be a rental unit since that time.

### STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the demolition permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

## **BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES**

## Isaac N. and Margaret Mayfield (ca. 1948 - ca. 1953)

Isaac N. Mayfield appears in the 1940 U.S. Census of the CCC Camp in Yoakum, Texas. He was 27, had been born in Texas, and was an engineer. He had lived in Austin in 1935. The 1930 U.S. Census shows him as the 16-year old son of Richard and Barbara Mayfield of Giddings, Texas. His father, Richard Mayfield, was a lawyer in Giddings. Neither Isaac nor his mother had an occupation listed. Isaac was the only child listed in the census report.

Isaac Mayfield died May 11, 2005 and was buried in Giddings, Texas. There was no obituary in the Austin newspaper.

### Ernest S. and Ruby R. Christian (ca. 1953 – ca. 1986)

Ernest S. and Ruby Ruth Christian appear in the 1940 U.S. Census for rural Yorktown, DeWitt County, Texas. They lived in a rented house on the Davey-Nopal Road. Ernest S. Christian was then 27, had been born in Texas, and was a salesman for a Watkins dealer. Ruby Ruth Christian was then 30, had been born in Texas, and was a public school teacher. They had lived in Gonzales, Texas in 1935. They had 2 children: Silabee Ann, 4; and Ernest, Jr., 3, as well as a housekeeper, Hedwig Biemer, 17, who had been born in Texas and had lived in rural DeWitt County in 1935.
