FLOODPLAIN DEFINITION

Depending on how much rain there's been, Austin's creeks may be bone dry, gently flowing with water or a raging torrent. The floodplain is the area of land that is likely to be under water when the creek rushes over its banks. In a sense, the floodplain is the full extension of the creek.

The 100-year floodplain is the land that is predicted to flood during a 100-year storm, which has a 1% chance of occurring in any given year. You may also hear the 100-year floodplain called the 1% annual chance floodplain or base flood. Areas within the 100-year floodplain may flood in much smaller storms as well. The 100-year floodplain is used by FEMA to administer the federal flood insurance program and the City of Austin to regulate development.

DEFINICIÓN DE PLANCIE DE INUNDACIÓN

Dependiendo de la cantidad de lluvia que haya habido, arroyos de Austin pueden ser completamente secos, fluir suavemente con agua o ser una torrente furiosa. La planicie de inundación es el área de tierra que es probable que sea bajo el agua cuando el arroyo se precipita sobre sus orillas. En cierto sentido, la planicie de inundación es la extensión completa de la quebrada.

La planicie de inundación de 100 años es la tierra que se prevé que las inundaciones durante una tormenta de 100 años, que tiene un 1% de probabilidad de ocurrir en cualquier año dado. Usted también puede oír la planicie de inundación de 100 años llamada la planicie de inundación base. Las áreas dentro de la zona de inundación de 100 años pueden inundar en las tormentas más pequeñas también. La planicie de inundación de 100 años es utilizada por FEMA para administrar el programa de seguro federal contra inundaciones y la ciudad de Austin para regular el desarrollo.



ABOUT THE MASTER PLAN

Answering the question, "What can OCMP become?" is the central focus of the Onion Creek Metro Park Master Plan (OCMP). Based on input from residents, community leaders and city planners, a master plan will be developed for the 555-acre regional park. The master planning process is being conducted in two phases and will take into account input from nearby residents, as well as the general public.

PHASE 1 - Vision Statement

PHASE 2 - Draft and Final Master Plan

The regional park master plan may include ideas for:

- improvements to open spaces and onion creek
- accessible trails for walking, running, or biking
- dog parks
- equestrian activities
- ball fields
- areas in the park for gatherings.
- recreation or multi-entertainment facilities
- exercise areas
- educational opportunities
- other ideas

The Austin Parks Foundation is leading the planning process in collaboration with the City of Austin Parks and Recreation Department.

The Master Plan is expected to be completed by the summer of 2015.

SOBRE EL PLAN MAESTRO

Respondiendo a la pregunta: "¿Qué puede llegar a ser OCMP?" es la meta central del Plan Maestro de Onion Creek Metro Park (OCMP). Con base en las aportaciones de los residentes, líderes comunitarios y planificadores de la ciudad, un Plan Maestro se desarrollará para el parque regional de 555 acres. El proceso de planificación se llevará a cabo en dos fases y tomará en cuenta las aportaciones de los residentes cercanos, así como las del público en general.

Fase 2 - Preparar Plan Preliminar y Plan Maestro final

El Plan Maestro del parque regional puede incluir ideas para:


- mejoramientos de espacios al aire libre y Onion Creek






