- Protect public health & safety

- Fragile Central Texas environment
- Climate change & drought
- State and regional regulatory complexity




Short Term Goal 1: Austin Water Revised Water Use Management Strategy

- August 2012 Council adopted revisions
- Revamped year-round mandatory watering schedule
- Includes four drought response stages

Ongoing & Long Term Goal 5:
Implementation of new Council approved
Austin Water rate structure

- Implementation of Council-approved Joint Committee recommendations
- New structure encourages conservation, provides price breaks for low income customers
- Maintains affordability and preserves financial stability



Short Term Goal 2: Watershed Protection Ordinance Revisions

- Recommended by Environmental Board July 2013
- Approved by Planning Commission August 27, 2013
- Approved by Council October 17, 2013
- Effective Date October 28, 2013




Watershed Protection Ordinance

Benefits of Enhanced Buffers

- Reduce channel erosion and property loss
- Provides community benefits
- Maintain good water quality

- Reduces Operation and Maintenance costs
- Helps control flood impacts





Ongoing & Long Term Goal 8: Watershed Protection Master Plan

- CIP Implementation ongoing
- Updated Watershed problem scores to ensure solution prioritization reflect current needs
- Implemented Program and Regulatory Enhancements
- Continue to keep Master Plan Document Updated



Implementing Imagine Austin In the Works

- Goal 4 Auxiliary Water Study
- Revise the Land Development Code to promote a compact and connected City (Related Priority Program)



Implementing Imagine Austin Ongoing

Goal 1 - Ongoing update to Austin Water's integrated water management plan

- Drought response planning
- Water conservation, climate mitigation and adaptation strategies

Goal 3 - Coordinate with Austin Energy on risks and mitigation related to water demands for power generation

- AW provides reclaimed water to Sandhill generation facility
- Drought response including LCRA pro-rata curtailment

Implementing Imagine Austin CIP Opportunities

- Approach Infrastructure Upgrades and Maintenance to facilitate a "Compact and Connected" future for Austin
- Projects evaluated using the Capital Planning Office criteria
- WPD FY 14 CIP Plan addresses critical needs and infrastructure upgrades
- Examples of two major AW CIP programs directly supporting IA and this Priority Program:
 - AW's Renewing Austin water main replacement program
 - AW's Reclaimed Water Program
