PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1949 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with synthetic siding and an attached side-gabled one-car garage; partial-width, flat-roofed, independent porch on plain, square, wood posts and turned railing balusters; paired 6:6 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house was built by the Dobbins-Campion Lumber Company in 1949; the first owners and occupants were Bryan O. Clark and his wife, Mary, who moved here from 502 Baylor Street; he was a salesman for Hutchins Bros., a men's furnishings store on Congress Avenue. The Clarks lived here until the early 1950s; the house was then owned and occupied by Mary B. Houston, a nurse, who lived here until around 1970. Mary Houston grew up on a farm in rural Travis County; the 1910 census report shows her as a young farm laborer on her parents' farm; by 1920, she was living with her widowed mother and 5 younger siblings in Austin. A retired couple lived in the house in the early 1970s; it was vacant for a period in the late 1970s, and has been a rental unit since the mid-1980s.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage re-use of the house if possible; it is a very good example of post-World War II middle-class residential architecture, with good minimal traditional design; if re-use of the house is not feasible, then encourage relocation over demolition, but release the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Mary B. Houston (ca. 1952 – ca. 1970)

Mary Houston appears in the 1920 U.S. Census as the 25-year old daughter of Hannah Houston, who lived at 2107 Neches Street in Austin. Mary Houston has been born in Texas and had no occupation listed. Her mother, Hannah, was a 42-year old Texas-born widow with no occupation listed. There were also 5 younger children in the family. The 1910 U.S. Census shows Mary B. Houston living with her parents, Albert and Hannah Houston, on a farm in Travis County, Texas. Her father was a general farmer; Mary was listed as a farm laborer.

Mary Houston died in Travis County on June 19, 1985; there was no obituary in the Austin newspapers.
