Additional Backup Information

The Austin Police Department is requesting council approval to accept \$50,000 in grant funding through the State of Texas, Governor's Office, Criminal Justice Division, Title V Program; and to amend the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Austin Police Department Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund to appropriate the funds for the Juvenile Gang Prevention and Intervention Coordination Project.

State grant funding will cover officer overtime costs for implementation of Gang Resistance and Education Awareness Training (GREAT summer camp) as well as individual and group mentoring activities for Austin's at-risk elementary, middle, and high school age youth. This is a continuation project. The current project will conclude June 30, 2014 having served over 200 elementary and middle school youth.
