Subject: Disaster Debris Clearance and Removal Service Agreements

The purpose of this item is to obtain a favorable ZWAC recommendation for the City Council to authorize award and execution of a total of four (4) contracts for disaster debris clearance and removal services through the **Houston-Galveston Area Council (H-GAC)** in a total not-to-exceed amount of **\$1,200,000**.

Purpose

H-GAC has established contracts with seven (7) national hauling firms for disaster debris clearance and removal services. H-GAC provided our scope of work to the seven (7) firms, and six (6) provided proposals for our consideration. H-GAC recommends that municipalities select one primary contractor and several back-up firms, in case the primary firm is unable to fulfill our requirements following a given disaster. The Federal Emergency Management Agency also recommends this practice. There is no expenditure of funds for these contracts unless and until we require the contractors' services.

The primary contract will be with **Ceres Environmental Services, Inc.** in Houston, and the back-up contracts will be awarded to: **Ashbritt, Inc.**, of Deerfield Beach, Florida; **Phillips & Jordan, Inc.** of Knoxville, Tennessee; and **Crowder Gulf** in Theodore, Alabama.

Each of the four (4) contracts will be for an initial period of 36 months, each in an amount of \$150,000, with three (3) 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 per extension option per contract. Each contract will be for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$300,000, and the total amount for the four (4) contracts will not exceed \$1,200,000.

Contract Timeline

April 21st – Proposals Submitted to H-GAC July 9th – ZWAC Recommendation August 7th – City Council Meeting

Staff Recommendation

Staff recommends City Council authorization of the award and execution of four (4) 36-month contracts with Ceres Environmental Services, Inc., Ashbritt, Inc., Phillips & Jordan, Inc., and Crowder Gulf for disaster debris clearance and removal services in an amount not to exceed \$150,000 each, with three (3) 12-month extension options each in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 per extension option. Each of the contracts will be for a total contract amount not to exceed \$300,000 for six (6) years. The total amount for the four (4) contracts will not exceed \$1,200,000.
