The Austin [re]Manufacturing Hub is a specialized eco-industrial park which will attract reuse and recycling manufacturers to the redeveloped former FM 812 Landfill site. Redeveloping this land through an eco-industrial park will provide local and sustainable recycling markets, reduce transportation costs and attract jobs and investment to Austin. The Austin [re]Manufacturing Hub will create an estimated 1,250 jobs and attract \$30 million in private investment. The City of Austin has completed site surveys, a Phase I environmental assessment, a land plan, a real estate appraisal, and preliminary infrastructure design.

Austin Resource Recovery has received a Federal grant of \$1,000,000 from the U.S. Economic Development Administration to partially fund the development of infrastructure on the site, specifically the construction of a waste water line to the site. Extension of wastewater services to both the hub and the surrounding un-served area will become a catalyst for what has been stagnated development along FM812 and FM973 as septic systems have not been adequate for this robust type of industrial development. The City contribution of \$2,075,745 is available from the \$2,750,000 appropriated in the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Capital Budget for the Austin [re]Manufacturing Hub, and this grant will have no impact on the General Fund.
