Additional Backup Information

On December 11, 2008, Council authorized the award, negotiation, and execution of a 60-month revenue contract with Carter Transportation Services, Inc. d/b/a Supershuttle of Austin, Inc., ("Concessionaire") to operate a demandresponsive shared ride shuttle service to transport passengers and baggage between Austin-Bergstrom International Airport ("ABIA") and locations within Austin, Texas and surrounding communities. The Concessionaire and the City of Austin Aviation Department entered into a Concession Lease Agreement dated March 1, 2009 (the "Agreement"). The term of the Agreement ended on April 1, 2014 and is currently under the holdover provision until August 1, 2014 and will continue month to month thereafter.

Extending the term for a maximum of two years allows the Aviation Department to prepare a new solicitation for airport shuttle services after certain Airport renovations are completed including the East Terminal Infill project and

the Consolidated Rental Car Facility. Until the new solicitation for airport shuttle services is developed, the Aviation Department and Concessionaire desire to amend the Agreement to add two (2) one (1) year extension options to the Agreement to provide and assure continuity of airport shuttle service at ABIA for the public.
