**Additional Backup Information**

The Parks and Recreation Department received a request on August 8, 2013 to name the 2 acre parkland located at 3000 Del Curto Rd, near South Lamar Boulevard. On October 23, 2010, the City of Austin Public Information Office (PIO) began the official 90-day period requesting nominations from the general public to name the parkland.

After the 90-day period, which ended on January 20, 2014, PARD received 2 nominations for the re-naming of the park. On April 14, 2014, the Land, Facilities and Programs Committee of the Parks Board heard public comment on the suggested names and forwarded one of the nominations from the community to the Parks & Recreation Board for action. On April 22, 2014, the Parks and Recreation Board voted to move forward with the name submitted to PARD for re-naming of parkland with a recommendation to the City Council on a vote of 7-0.

On June 12, 2014, the City Council postponed action on this item to June 26, 2014 with direction that this item return to the Parks and Recreation Board for public comment and action. On June 24, 2014, the Parks and Recreation reconsidered this item but did not forward a new recommendation to City Council. On June 26, 2014, Council approved naming neighbour park Thomas Lasseter Neighborhood Park on first reading.
