Authorize award and execution of a 36-month requirements supply agreement with CUMMINS SOUTHERN PLAINS, LLC to provide parts and repair services for Cummins compressed natural gas engines in an amount not to exceed \$1,561,815, with three 12-month extension options in a total amount not to exceed \$520,605 per extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$3,123,630.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$86,768 is available in the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Operating Budget of the Fleet Services Department. Funding for the remaining 34-months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

Additional Backup Information				

This contract will provide repair services and associated parts for Cummins CNG Engine equipped vehicles in the City Departments. The City's current fleet consists of approximately 50 trucks that are equipped with the Cummins CNG-powered engines. A majority of these vehicles are used for refuse and recycle collection. All CNG engine repairs will be performed by the recommended vendor.

The City of Austin Fleet Services Department is not currently certified to make fuel-related repairs to engines powered by CNG. In order for a facility to be certified for CNG repairs, it must meet ventilation requirements as outlined in the National Fire Protection Association code and City of Austin Fire Department code when handling gases that are lighter than air. In addition, repair technicians must successfully complete mandatory Cummins factory training in order to be authorized to provide warranty repairs. CNG engines offer lower greenhouse gas emissions over conventional fueled vehicles.
