#### - Distracted Driving Ordinance

• Council passed the distracted driving ordinance which PAC made recommendations on. Because of amendments, the law department is still finalizing language. Here is a <u>draft version</u>. The ordinance requires hands-free operation of electronic devices and applies to motor vehicles and bicyclists, but not to pedestrians. The ordinance does not apply to motor vehicles stopped at stop lights which are at a complete stop.
