### Additional Backup Information

On April 25, 2013 the Austin City Council amended the Universal Recycling Ordinance (URO), expanding recycling requirements to all non-residential properties with a food service permit (including mobile food vendors, effective October 1, 2017) to divert organic materials. As a part of the URO Administrative Rule amendment process, staff conducted stakeholder meetings specific to mobile food vendors. Stakeholders included service providers, restaurant owners, commissary kitchen owners, mobile food court property owners and owners of mobile food trailers, as well as Watershed Protection (WPD), Planning and Development Review (PDRD), Code Compliance (CCD) and Health and Human Services (HHSD) department representatives.

Council Resolution 20140501-038 directed the City Manager to present a draft ordinance that would allow mobile food establishments to provide solid waste, recycling, compost, or used oil receptacles on the same property and detached from the mobile food establishment.

The current City Code allows mobile food establishments to provide containers for collection of solid waste, recycling, compost, and used oil. However, all containers must be attached to or contained within the mobile food trailer.

To address Council Resolution 20140501-038, City Code Chapter 10-3 will be amended to allow that enforcement be waived for receptacles required to comply with the Universal Recycling Ordinance.
