### Additional Backup Information

A request has been received for the aerial encroachment of right-of-way by a pedestrian bridge at 601 East 15<sup>th</sup> Street. The proposed aerial encroachment envelope is 20 feet wide and 20 feet high, and will span the approximate 100-foot right-of-way width.

A teaching hospital connected with and located next to the proposed Dell Medical School will have significant and

lasting benefits on Central Texas healthcare for decades in the future. The proposed pedestrian bridge will connect the existing hospital parking garage on the south side of 15<sup>th</sup> Street with the future Dell Medical School on the north side of 15<sup>th</sup> Street.

The requirement of payment of an appraised value was waived by City Council on June 12, 2014, by Ordinance No. 20140612-063.
