Recent growth patterns have suggested that Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (ABIA) will need additional space for both passengers utilizing the terminal and aircraft parking at the terminal gates as soon as 2015. Currently, ABIA has 24 contact gates which have boarding bridges that service airplanes parked at each gate. The terminal is nearing its service capacity of 11 million total passengers.

In keeping with the recommendations in both the 2003 and 2008 Master Plan and Master Plan Phasing Projects, respectively, this project expands the existing terminal to the east. This expansion will "balance" the terminal and provide much needed space for the ever-expanding passenger and aircraft operational numbers. The terminal addition will be able to accommodate approximately 4 million additional passengers per year for a total of 15 million annual passengers — an increase of 27% that will provide a passenger level of service through 2025.

The Construction Manager-At-Risk (CMR) method is a project delivery method where the City will contract with an architect/engineer to perform design services and separately contract with a CMR to perform preconstruction and construction phase services.

Following Council authorization, the City will negotiate and execute a contract with Hensel Phelps Construction Company for preconstruction phase services for an amount not to exceed \$1,806,000. Hensel Phelps will begin collaborating with the City and the design firm throughout the design development to include constructability and scope reviews for optimal design; control of costs; preparation of budgets and schedules; construction trade outreach; and procurement of construction.

Preconstruction phase services (concurrently with design) is anticipated to extend until mid-late summer of 2015, at which time the construction manager will be expected to propose a guaranteed maximum price (GMP) proposal for the first phase of construction. It has not yet been determined the number of phases or GMP proposals for construction. Completion of all work is anticipated to be mid-2018.

This RCA is to request funding authorization in the amount of \$1,720,000 for preconstruction phase services plus \$86,000 owner contingency.

The top-ranked CMR firm was selected by a City-staffed review panel that evaluated and scored proposals based on published evaluation criteria to determine the highest ranked proposer. The City selected the CMR firm that will provide the "best value" to the City for preconstruction and construction services for the project in accordance with Government Code 2269.

The DBE participation goal stated in the solicitation was 9.63%. The top-ranked CMR firm provided a DBE compliance plan that met the goal of the solicitation and was approved by the Small and Minority Business Resources Department.

Notification of issuance of a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the Construction Manager-at-Risk contract was sent to 296 firms on May 19, 2014. The RFQ was obtained by 129 firms and three firms submitted statements of qualifications. None of the firms were certified MBE/WBE firms. All three firms were evaluated and two firms were short-listed and asked to provide proposals. Proposals were evaluated and both shortlisted firms were interviewed. 	Additional Backup Information

On December 16, 2010, a contract with The Cooperative Purchasing Network was established in an amount not to exceed of \$421,875 for a three-month period with four 12-month extension options in an amount not exceed \$1,687,500 per extension option. Additional funding was added on April 26, 2012 bringing the total contract amount to \$11,615,360.

This contract provides a reliable source for the purchase of industrial supplies, equipment, and tools used by various City departments to repair and maintain their facilities and equipment throughout the City. It will be used by most City departments to purchase small equipment and supplies on an as-needed basis for daily operations. Staff will have quick and reliable access to all products available from Grainger's on-line ordering system.

The list of items available to the City encompasses a wide variety of repair and maintenance equipment and supplies, including but not limited to: safety, electrical, plumbing, fleet vehicle maintenance and testing, HVAC testing and maintenance, janitorial and cleaning, electrical hand tools, hardware, small electrical motors and generators, lighting, security, and test instruments.

The recommended Council action is to approve an increase for Option Year 4 in the amount of \$2,000,000 due to an increased use of this contract by departments throughout the City.

Additional Backup Information

Austin-Bergstrom Landhost Enterprises, Inc. (ABLE) is a public facility corporation created by the City to develop and operate the airport hotel at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (Airport). In order to finance the construction and equipping of the Airport hotel, ABLE issued revenue bonds. Currently, ABLE is not meeting its debt service requirements under those bonds due to the initial large debt issuance, high interest rates, and other economic factors. As a result, the City and ABLE desire to restructure ABLE's debt and acquire additional capital for necessary hotel improvements. ABLE retained professional services in order to restructure its debt and the City agreed to pay the initial deposits required to retain certain professionals with expertise in debt restructuring. Accordingly, on June 18, 2014, the City entered into an agreement with ABLE to allow ABLE to retain professional services with expertise in debt restructuring. Such agreement requires ABLE to reimburse the City for the amounts paid to the professionals within 6 months from the effective date of the agreement. Due to continuous and lengthy negotiations with bondholders, ABLE continues to rely on these professionals in an effort to refinance its debt and make necessary capital improvements to the hotel. Accordingly, the City and ABLE desire to amend the agreement to increase the deposit amounts made under those contracts between ABLE and the professionals with expertise in debt restructuring.

Approval of this request will allow the City Manager or the Executive Director of the Department of Aviation to execute the grants offered by the Federal Aviation Administration, the Department of Homeland Security, and other state and federal agencies to Austin-Bergstrom International Airport during the Fiscal Year 2014-2015. This will allow the City to be in a position to quickly accept and execute grant offers as they are made available.

Grant amounts, as they may become available, would fund terminal area improvements, noise mitigation, airfield improvements, and security related projects at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport and reduce the need to utilize airport-generated capital. Grant funding may also reimburse operating expenses.
