#### **SUMMARY STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff supports the amended rezoning request. Staff recommends general commercial services-mixed use-conditional overlay-neighborhood plan (CS-MU-CO-NP) combining district zoning. The conditional overlay would include the following:

- 1. Vehicular trips shall be less than 2,000 vehicles per day.
- 2. The following shall be removed from the list of prohibited land uses: Outdoor Entertainment.
- 3. The following shall be added to the list of prohibited land uses: Alternative Financial Services, Bail Bond Services, Pedicab Storage/Dispatch, and Guidance Services.
- 4. All other land uses prohibited by the conditional overlay established with City File # C14-99-2061 shall remain prohibited, and include: Hospital Services (General), Maintenance and Service Facilities, Art and Craft Studio (General), Automotive Rental, Automotive Repair Services, Automotive Sales, Automotive Washing (Of Any Type), Business or Trade School, Business Support Services, Campground, Commercial Blood Plasma Center, Commercial Off-Street Parking, Consumer Convenience Services, Consumer Repair Services, Convenience Storage, Drop-Off Recycling Collection Facility, Electronic Prototype Assembly, Equipment Repair Services, Equipment Sales, Limited Warehousing & Distribution, Exterminating Services, Community Recreation (Public & Private), Financial Services, Food Sales, Funeral Services, General Retail Sales (Convenience), General Retail Sales (General), Kennels, Laundry Services, Monument Retail Sales, Off-Site Accessory Parking, Outdoor Sports and Recreation, Pawn Shop Services, Personal Improvement Services, Personal Services, Pet Services, Research Services, Restaurant (Drive-In, Fast Food), Restaurant (Limited, General), Service Station, Theater, Vehicle Storage, Veterinary Services, Custom Manufacturing, Club or Lounge, College and University Facilities, Congregate Living, Residential Treatment, Transitional Housing, Transportation Terminal, Hotel-Motel, Indoor Entertainment, and Indoor Sports and Recreation.

- 6. No Outdoor Entertainment events shall occur within 80 feet from any property zoned or used as single family residential.
- 7. The maximum number of Outdoor Entertainment events per year is 30.

ON SCHOOL DAYS; AND THE DECIBEL LIMIT AT THE PROPERTY LINE SHALL BE 75 db MAXIMUM. (8-0) [J. Nortey- 1<sup>st</sup>, A. Hernandez- 2<sup>nd</sup>]

#### **ISSUES:**

The subject property is currently an urban farm which has been in operation since 2009. The City of Austin created the urban farm land use in 2000, permitting the use in all zoning classifications. Urban farm regulations were addressed again in 2012-2013 to add more detailed requirements, including limits on outdoor events like weddings or parties.

Urban farms in residential and office zoning classifications are required to obtain temporary use permits (TUPs) for each outdoor entertainment event, and are limited to six (6) events per year. Outdoor entertainment is a conditional land use in commercial and industrial classifications, including CS zoning. Consequently, for urban farms on commercial or industrial zoned properties, a conditional land use plan must be approved by the appropriate land use commission, and there is no limit on the number of outdoor entertainment events. The CS-MU-CO-NP zoning on the subject property, however, includes a conditional overlay that prohibits outdoor entertainment as well as most other commercial and industrial land uses. Please refer to *Exhibit A (Zoning Ordinance)*.

A restrictive covenant termination (C14-99-2061(RCT)) and a Neighborhood Plan Amendment (NPA-2014-0016.02) to the Govalle-Johnston Terrace Neighborhood Plan have been filed in conjunction with this rezoning request. All three requests are recommended for approval by Staff. The neighborhood contact team has filed a Valid Petition against the rezoning request; at time of the preparation of this report, 20.08% of applicable signatures have been obtained. Please refer to *Exhibit B (Valid Petition)*.

## **DEPARTMENT COMMENTS:**

The subject property is located between Springdale Road and Mansell Avenue, with frontage on both streets. It is a half-block north of Gonzalez Street and a half-block south of Glissman Road. The property is currently developed with an urban farm land use. Immediately to the north are single family residences and a church zoned SF-3-NP. To the east, across Mansell Avenue, is the former Allen Elementary, which is zoned P-NP, and is currently used as an AISD storage facility. Immediately south of the subject property are single family residences zoned SF-3-NP. Across Springdale Road to the west are single family residences zoned SF-3-NP and a police substation zoned P-NP. Please refer to *Exhibits C and D (Zoning Map and Aerial Exhibit)*.

#### **ZONING HISTORY:**

The subject tract was zoned LI and SF-3 upon annexation. The properties in the annexation area were zoned based on their existing land uses. In 1998, The Planning Commission initiated rezoning most of the industrial properties in the area to SF-3 zoning, but the case was withdrawn by Commission about two months later.

In 1999, the property was rezoned from LI and SF-3 to CS-MU-CO-NP. The land use at the time was landscaping and lawn maintenance. The conditional overlay attached to the zoning was significantly more restrictive than the previous LI zoning or the base CS zoning. The rezoning granted general commercial services-mixed use (CS-MU) as the base zoning, but the conditional overlay prohibited the following land uses: Hospital Services (General), Maintenance and Service Facilities, Art and Craft Studio (General), Automotive Rental, Automotive Repair Services, Automotive Sales, Automotive Washing (Of Any Type), Business or Trade School, Business Support Services, Campground, Commercial Blood Plasma Center, Commercial Off-Street Parking, Consumer Convenience Services, Consumer Repair Services, Convenience Storage, Drop-Off Recycling Collection Facility,

Electronic Prototype Assembly, Equipment Repair Services, Equipment Sales, Limited Warehousing & Distribution, Exterminating Services, Community Recreation (Public & Private), Financial Services, Food Sales, Funeral Services, General Retail Sales (Convenience), General Retail Sales (General), Kennels, Laundry Services, Monument Retail Sales, Off-Site Accessory Parking, Outdoor Sports and Recreation, Pawn Shop Services, Personal Improvement Services, Personal Services, Pet Services, Research Services, Restaurant (Drive-In, Fast Food), Restaurant (Limited, General), Service Station, Theater, Vehicle Storage, Veterinary Services, Custom Manufacturing, Club or Lounge, College and University Facilities, Congregate Living, Residential Treatment, Transitional Housing, Transportation Terminal, Hotel-Motel, Indoor Entertainment, and Indoor Sports and Recreation. In addition to the CS-MU-CO-NP zoning designation, a Restrictive Covenant (RC) was filed in conjunction with the zoning case. This Restrictive Covenant requires the property to rollback to SF-3 (now SF-3-NP) The RC stated that the owner of the property would not protest a "rollback" of the zoning of the property, which would return to family residence (SF-3) and limited industrial services (LI) zoning if the property ceased for ninety (90) consecutive days to contain one of the following land uses: construction sales and services, agricultural sales and services, building maintenance services, and plant nursery. Please refer to *Exhibit E (Restrictive Covenant)*.

## **REZONING REQUEST:**

The Applicant proposes removing Outdoor entertainment from the list of prohibited land uses, making it a conditional land use, as is permitted in the base CS zoning classification. The Applicant has amended their request since the original in response to feedback from neighborhood representatives and City Staff. Key changes include eliminating a request to allow Restaurant (Limited) as a permitted use, and several restrictions on the proposed Outdoor entertainment land use. The Applicant has proposed limiting the hours for Outdoor entertainment to 10:00 AM-11:00 PM, Friday and Saturday, and 11:00 AM-10 PM, Sunday through Thursday. The Applicant proposes 80-foot setbacks from residential properties for Outdoor entertainment events. The Applicant also proposes a limit of 30 Outdoor entertainment events per year.

Correspondence received in favor or opposition of the rezoning request is attached. Please refer to *Exhibit F* (*Correspondence*).

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff supports the amended rezoning request. Staff recommends general commercial services-mixed use-conditional overlay-neighborhood plan (CS-MU-CO-NP) combining district zoning. The conditional overlay would include the following:

- 1. Vehicular trips shall be less than 2,000 vehicles per day.
- 2. The following shall be removed from the list of prohibited land uses: Outdoor Entertainment.

- 7. The maximum number of Outdoor Entertainment events per year is 30.

## **BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION**

1. Zoning should allow for a reasonable use of the property.

Urban farms are 1 to 5 acre properties, per City Code. At this scale, an urban farm cannot remain viable solely through agricultural production. Accessory land uses like outdoor entertainment are important for viability. The existing CS-MU-CO-NP zoning on the property has eliminated a majority of the land uses that are permitted in the base zoning category, significantly reducing development potential.

- 2. Zoning should not constitute a grant of special privilege to an individual owner; Granting of the request should result in an equal treatment of similarly situated properties.
  - By City Code, all urban farms in non-residential and non-office based zoning classifications include Outdoor entertainment as a Conditional land use, unless similarly encumbered with a conditional overlay.
- 3. Zoning changes should promote compatibility with adjacent and nearby uses and should not result in detrimental impacts to the neighborhood character.
  - With City of Austin compatibility standards and the conditional land use site plan permitting process, Staff believes the proposed Outdoor entertainment land use can be appropriately developed on a 4.848 acre tract. The Applicant has offered additional restrictions that increase setbacks, reduce hours of

operation, and greatly reduces the maximum number of events per year. These restrictions further encourage compatibility.

4. The proposed zoning should be consistent with the purpose statement of the district sought.

General commercial services is intended allow Outdoor entertainment as a Conditional land use; it is only prohibited on the subject property through a conditional overlay that was created when the property was a tree nursery with a rollback zoning restrictive covenant.

#### SITE PLAN

- SP1 Site plans will be required for any new development other than single-family or duplex residential.
- SP2 Any development which occurs in an SF-6 or less restrictive zoning district which is located 540-feet or less from property in an SF-5 or more restrictive zoning district will be subject to compatibility development regulations.
- SP3 Any new development is subject to Subchapter E. Design Standards and Mixed Use. Additional comments will be made when the site plan is submitted.
- SP4 The site is subject to compatibility standards. Along the north, south, and the west property line, the following standards apply:
  - No structure may be built within 25 feet of the property line.
- No structure in excess of two stories or 30 feet in height may be constructed within 50 feet of the property line.
- No structure in excess of three stories or 40 feet in height may be constructed within 100 feet of the property line.
  - No parking or driveways are allowed within 25 feet of the property line.
- A landscape area at least 25 feet wide is required along the property line. In addition, a fence, berm, or dense vegetation must be provided to screen adjoining properties from views of parking, mechanical equipment, storage, and refuse collection.
- SP5 This property is within the Controlled Compatible Land Use Area defined by Chapter 241 of the Local Government Code. Development on this property is limited by Chapter 25-13 of the Austin City Code. Airport hazards as defined in Federal Aviation Regulations Part 77, as adopted by the City in Sections 25-13-23, are prohibited. For more information, contact Joe Medici, Noise Abatement Officer at (512) 530-6652.
- SP6 Additional design regulations will be enforced at the time a site plan is submitted.

#### TRANSPORTATION

- TR 1 A review of parking, driveway, and ADA facilities for the proposed uses will take place at time of site plan.
- TR 2 A traffic impact analysis was waived for this case because the applicant agreed to limit the intensity and uses for this development. If the zoning is granted, development should be limited through a conditional overlay to less than 2,000 vehicle trips per day. [LDC, 25-6-117]
- TR 3 According to the Austin 2009 Bicycle Plan Update approved by Austin City Council in June, 2009, bicycle facilities exist and are recommended along the Springdale Road as follows: Bike Lanes.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL**

1. The site is not located over the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone. The site is located in the Boggy Creek Watershed of the Colorado River Basin, which is classified as an Urban Watershed by Chapter 25-8 of the City's Land Development Code. It is in the Desired Development Zone.

- 2. Zoning district impervious cover limits apply in the Urban Watershed classification.
- 3. According to floodplain maps there is no floodplain within or adjacent to the project location. However, COA GIS shows a Critical Water Quality Zone located across the property. Development is limited in the Critical Water Quality Zone per LDC 25-8-261 & 262.
- 4. Standard landscaping and tree protection will be required in accordance with LDC 25-2 and 25-8 for all development and/or redevelopment.
- 5. Numerous trees will likely be impacted with a proposed development associated with this rezoning case. Please be aware that an approved rezoning status does not eliminate a proposed development's requirements to meet the intent of the tree ordinances. If further explanation or specificity is needed, please contact the City Arborist at 974-1876. At this time, site specific information is unavailable regarding other vegetation, areas of steep slope, or other environmental features such as bluffs, springs, canyon rimrock, caves, sinkholes, and wetlands.
- 6. This site is required to provide on-site water quality controls (or payment in lieu of) for all development and/or redevelopment when 8,000 s.f. cumulative is exceeded, and on site control for the two-year storm.
- 7. At this time, no information has been provided as to whether this property has any preexisting approvals that preempt current water quality or Code requirements.

#### WATER UTILITY

WW1. The landowner intends to serve the site with City of Austin water and wastewater utilities. The landowner, at own expense, will be responsible for providing any water and wastewater utility improvements, offsite main extensions, utility relocations and or abandonments required by the land use. The water and wastewater utility plan must be reviewed and approved by the Austin Water Utility for compliance with City criteria and suitability for operation and maintenance. Depending on the development plans submitted, water and or wastewater service extension requests may be required. All water and wastewater construction must be inspected by the City of Austin. The landowner must pay the City inspection fee with the utility construction. The landowner must pay the tap and impact fee once the landowner makes an application for a City of Austin water and wastewater utility tap permit.

AN ORDINANCE REZONING AND CHANGING THE ZONING MAP ACCOMPANYING CHAPTER 25-2 OF THE CITY CODE AS FOLLOWS:

LOTS 6-8, OUTLOTS 29-30, J. GODWIN JONES SUBDIVISION, FROM LIMITED INDUSTRIAL SERVICES (LI) DISTRICT AND FAMILY RESIDENCE (SF-3) DISTRICT TO GENERAL COMMERCIAL SERVICES-MIXED USE-CONDITIONAL OVERLAY (CS-MU-CO) COMBINING DISTRICT, LOCALLY KNOWN AS 755 SPRINGDALE ROAD, IN THE CITY OF AUSTIN, TRAVIS COUNTY, TEXAS.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

PART 1. The Zoning Map established by Section 25-2-191 of the City Code is amended to change the base district from Limited Industrial Services (LI) district and Family Residence (SF-3) district to General Commercial Services-Mixed Use-Conditional Overlay (CS-MU-CO) combining district on the property described in File C14-99-2061, as follows:

Lots 6-8, Outlots 29-30, Division A, less the west 17.88 feet, J. Godwin Jones Subdivision, Original City of Austin, Travis County, Texas, according to the map or plat on file in the General Land Office of the State of Texas, (the "Property")

locally known as 755 Springdale Road, in the City of Austin, Travis County, Texas, and as more particularly identified in the map attached as Exhibit "A".

- PART 2. The Property within the boundaries of the conditional overlay combining district established by this ordinance is subject to the following conditions:
- 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of the City Code applicable to the Property on the effective date of this ordinance or at the time an application for approval of a site plan or building permit is submitted, no site plan for development of the Property, or any portion of the Property, may be approved or released, and no building permit for construction of a building on the Property, may be issued if the completed development or uses authorized by the proposed site plan or building permit, considered cumulatively with all existing or previously authorized development and uses of the Property, generates traffic exceeding the total traffic generation of 2,000 trips per day.







WHEREAS, the Owner of the Property and the City of Austin have agreed that the Property should be impressed with certain covenants and restrictions;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is declared that the Owner of the Property, for the consideration, shall hold, sell and convey the Property, subject to the following covenants and restrictions impressed upon the Property by this restrictive covenant. 

## Good Morning Ms. Chaffin:

I am writing on behalf of Springdale Farm in the hope that council members will give serious attention to the dilemma in which its owners find themselves -- specifically as it addresses the importance of allowing Springdale (and Austin's other urban farms) to function and flourish as the community gathering places that they indeed are.

Much has been made of the elitist nature of urban farms, but little is made of the work they do on behalf of Austin's broader community. Excess produce is shared with nonprofits that feed the homeless. School expeditions introduce children to where their food really comes from. They are eco-tourism in microcosm. These farms become destinations for other nonprofits that raise funds for other food-related projects. And yes, they also sustain themselves by hosting weddings and other celebratory events.

I have my own problems with Austin's elitism, but I don't find the owners of urban farms to fit into this category. Urban farmers are men and women who struggle daily to keep alive a time-honored practice of sowing and harvesting, a practice that time has almost forgotten. Urban farmers might open their farms to high-dollar events, but they also provide employment for people who might not be otherwise able to find meaningful work. They made Austin's farmers markets possible.

But I'm also writing because I feel the need to speak out against bigotry wherever I find it. While I'm not at all clear on why there is such adamant resistance to the continued success of our urban farms -- Springdale in particular -- I am concerned that displeasure with the proprietors is purported to be rooted in racism. I find this reprehensible.

As a black woman I'm extremely sensitive to what has historically happened to the minority community on Austin's East Side. I live in East Austin. I shop there, vote there and have friends there. But I also accept the fact that time marches on, and if there are other objections to the gentrification of this part of the city, I would gladly support an effort to get first-rate affordable housing and sidewalks and lights included in plans. I cannot in good conscience, however, not speak out on behalf of those who are already in place, trying to make a difference. They bought land no one else had purchased and built a business.

I therefore ask that the council amend the overlay that prevents Springdale from augmenting its revenue by holding social functions.

Dear Austin City Councilmembers,

I am writing to support Springdale Farm's efforts to host community gatherings such as supper clubs, wedding ceremonies and civic fundraisers on their property. In order to proceed, they have submitted three applications/requests with the City of Austin.

First, Springdale Farm has submitted an application to modify an existing conditional overlay to remove outdoor entertainment from the list of prohibitions. This would allow the property to host community events, including weddings, civic fundraisers, supper clubs and such. Without the flexibility to offer space for these events, the farm would be forced to close its doors.

Second, Springdale Farm is seeking to terminate a restrictive covenant that was put on the property in 1999, which states that if they should ever cease to run their landscape business, the zoning would revert back to Light Industry and Single Family. The evolution of the property as an Urban Farm, a use not defined in the Code at the time of the original covenant, has extended the property beyond the limitations in the covenant.

Finally, I urge to you grant the farm's request to change to their Future Land Use Map from Single Family to Mixed Use. They are currently operating under a Commercial Services zoning of CS-MU, which does not account for their true variety of uses.

Springdale Farm is a gem that helps make our community special. I am confident that Council and city staff can find a solution that benefits all stakeholders. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact my office at (512) 463-0674.

The purpose of this letter is to express full support in allowing farmers Glenn and Paula Foore of Springdale Farm to continue what they've been doing for our area – providing healthy, real, accessible food (available both directly to consumers via their weekly farm stand as well as indirectly by supplying many of our local restaurants); opening up their farm for educational purposes regarding food production; and inviting folks to celebrate momentous life occasions in a beautiful rural, yet urban setting.

The hurdles and challenges that they have been through in the past year are threatening to close down their farm. Apart from wanting to support them for the reasons above, besides the fact that they are just downright amazing, kind, and generous people, we hope that they remain open for purely selfish reasons, as detailed below.

First and foremost, I can think of no better example apart from the fact that my two-year old son Everett refuses to eat carrots sourced or purchased from any grocery store; yet he will eat those dug from the dirt at Springdale Farm. (Even when cooked, he rejects store-bought carrots but will still eat Springdale Farm carrots.) This may sound trivial, but what is more important than the health of our children? It is saddening that so much of our youth does not know real food when they see it. Even Everett's young palate enjoys the flavors of a fresh carrot grown in sustainable, responsible ways. Springdale Farm has opened up their farm to other children (as well as adults!) for educational endeavors and tours, showing how healthy, delicious food is grown and harvested. And our kids don't have to drive an hour out of town to witness it; the beauty is that the farm is located where it is needed most – right here within Austin. On top of that, Springdale Farm opens up their farm for people to visit. Each weekend, Everett wants to visit farmers Glenn and Paula "and their chickens and ducks." There are many benefits regarding the growth of Austin; however, one of the negative impacts is that our green spaces are disappearing. In fact, since we've started visiting the farm, we now have many friends with kids who also make the weekly trip to visit the animals. We appreciate that Springdale Farm is only a short drive away and is somewhere we can take our child to play, see animals, and learn about food.

In addition to supporting us personally, the existence of Springdale Farm has supported me professionally as well. My husband and I own a cheese shop here in Austin, and Springdale Farm supplies us with fresh harvest to complement our cheeses. Not only does this help us economically, but it's a great convenience to our customers as well. Additionally, in the Spring of 2013, our business sought to launch a new endeavor we call our Pop-Up Picnics. We announce via social media that we're at a specific location handing out free cheese plates; if folks so choose, they can make a donation. Glenn

and Paula graciously offered Springdale Farm as the first location of our Pop-Up Picnic. They did this *for free*. We gave out 200 cheese picnic boxes within 30 minutes and made over \$1000 which was then donated to a local non-profit, the Sustainable Food Center. The graciousness of Paula and Glenn to do this (knowing that they could use the money too) shows that they are more interested in being a part of and contributing to our community.

The fact is that farming is not very lucrative, but people do it because they believe it's important. To be able to farm and provide us with all the benefits of local, organic, healthy food, Springdale Farm needs the potential additional income that opening up their farm to host events allows. If they are unable to books these events, the likelihood that they will have to close the gates to their farm for good is all too high. If that happens, not only will I lose a place to celebrate good food and to play outdoors with my children, as well as a source of food for my business and a location to host community events, but we'll all lose a gem that has actively worked towards making Austin unique. More importantly, we'll have let down two farmers (and their team) who have worked tirelessly to support and give to our community. It's time for Austin to support them back. I am writing to express my support for Springdale Farm, in its request for zoning change to lift the restrictive covenant (or overlay) prohibiting outdoor entertainment on their commercially zoned property and amend the Future Land Use Map. The weddings, supper clubs, dinners and other events benefit the community and the City of Austin as well. This request is to keep the issue on the Planning Commission Agenda for September 28, 2014.

It is my understanding that Daniel Llanes, the president of the Johnston-Govalle Terrace Contact team will ask to postpone this agenda item to give the contact team more time with this issue. I attended the first meeting with the contact team, on September 10, 2014, wherein Mr. Llanes took over the meeting and didn't even allow the Foore's attorney to present her power point presentation to explain the issues. I believe she got to page 2, of her multi-page presentation. At that meeting, Llanes presented a petition signed by some neighbors against the zoning change, and told the Foores that none of this would be happening, had they not taken the side of HausBar Farms in November of 2013, when the Amendment to the Urban Farm Ordinance was at issue. # PUBLIC HEARING INFORMATION

This zoning/rezoning request will be reviewed and acted upon at two public hearings: before the Land Use Commission and the City Council. Although applicants and/or their agent(s) are expected to attend a public hearing, you are not required to attend. However, if you do attend, you have the opportunity to speak FOR or AGAINST the proposed development or change. You may also contact a neighborhood or environmental organization that has expressed an interest in an application affecting your neighborhood.

During its public hearing, the board or commission may postpone or continue an application's hearing to a later date, or may evaluate the City staff's recommendation and public input forwarding its own recommendation to the City Council. If the board or commission announces a specific date and time for a postponement or continuation that is not later than 60 days from the announcement, no further notice is required.

During its public hearing, the City Council may grant or deny a zoning request, or rezone the land to a less intensive zoning than requested but in no case will it grant a more intensive zoning.

However, in order to allow for mixed use development, the Council may add the MIXED USE (MU) COMBINING DISTRICT to certain commercial districts. The MU Combining District simply allows residential uses in addition to those uses already allowed in the seven commercial zoning districts. As a result, the MU Combining District allows the combination of office, retail, commercial, and residential uses within a single development.

# Postponement Request to after Nov. 8th: Springdale Farm

Planning Commissioners,

There is a valid petition opposing the FLUM change and the prohibited use change for Springdale Farm, which has been signed by 22 of the 33 households surrounding Springdale Farm. This petition was submitted at the Sept. 14th meeting convened at Willie Mea Kirk Library by City staff person Maureen Meredith.

At that meeting there were no details or specifics given on the City's governing criteria for an outdoor event center, what the rules for an outdoor event center look like or what specifically the applicant was proposing.

It wasn't until I got an email from City staff person Heather Chaffin on Oct. 7 outlining staff recommendations. This was the first time any of us saw any detail or specific criteria for what is being proposed. The Contact Team and the immediate neighbors did not have this information on or prior to Sept. 14th, and we have not had the opportunity to discuss this as a group.

This is why today we are opposed to any proposed changes.

I will say that we are categorically opposed and will continue to oppose any change to the FLUM and termination of conditional use overlay, but we are willing to consider the prohibited use change if we can find common ground.

"There is a wide variation in what constitutes a farm in the United States; however, when asked the question, 'How large would a crop and livestock operation have to be to be considered economically viable for the long term?' a group of Purdue University agricultural economists offered the following response in 2002:

An economically viable crop/livestock operation in the Corn Belt would have between 2,000 and 3,000 acres of row crops and between 500 and 600 sows."\*

If it takes that much land and that many pigs for a mid-West farm to make it, imagine what it costs an Austin urban farmer where utilities, water, taxes, feed and services are more expensive.

As one of the few professional, full-time farmers in Central Texas, we know first hand that to be economically viable, farmers must do much more than grow food. As we celebrate nearly ten years of growing certified organic foods, Green Gate Farms, oversees more than 20 diversified enterprises.

We began as a five-acre vegetable farm with a Community Supported Agriculture (CSA) membership program dedicated to serving our neighbors. Our goal was for the farm to pay for itself, but tractors, infrastructure and antiquated regulation are expensive. Increased production expanded sales at our farm stand, farmers' markets, and to wholesalers, but that did not cover the bills.

"Farm production expenses average \$109,359 per year per farm," according to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.\* Most American farmers address this expense by taking off-farm jobs and/or draining their savings. My husband and I have done both over the years and it's not sustainable.

What makes better business sense is to respond to customer requests. And after years of hosting fundraisers for neighborhood schools and community groups at no cost, economics dictated that we expand to renting our farm for weddings, dinners and events. This year round income has become critically important to our seasonal cash flow.

While Green Gate Farms would prefer to run only one farm enterprise, drought, fire and a recent car accident, have proven that farm resiliency requires diverse income streams.

We urge you to support Springdale Farm's innovative efforts to provide a necessary and visionary business service to Austin. In an era of diet-induced disease, you can increase access to healthy food by ensuring the financial health of this diversified and beautiful urban farm.

I am writing to you on behalf of the Govalle/Johnston Terrace Neighborhood Contact Team.

Regarding Springdale Farm, case # C14-99-2061, we are asking for a postponement to any date after November 8th.

The public meeting convened at Willie Mea Kirk Library by City Staff person Maureen Meredith on September 14th, 2014 gave legal public notice about the proposed land use change and the proposed change to the conditional use overlay. But there was no legal public notice and consequently there was no discussion about terminating the conditional use overlay. There we no details given during this meeting about the specifics of any of these proposed changes. The immediate neighbors and the Contact Team have not had an opportunity to discuss, as a group, the implications of this proposed change.

#### Good Evening,

I would like to start of this email by thanking you for your time and attention to this matter.

First of all, I object the request set by Springdale Farms ALL three of the forementioned agenda items/ cases:

-Safety concerns, on my street of Glissman Road there are around 8 neighborhood children, who have had to restrain from normal child activities such as bike riding and other sports because it is simply unsafe for them to do so when the farm has one of their many events. When 200+ people visit the farms that adds around 100 more cars passing through our residential streets, many who are unaware of the children since they don't live in the area. Leaving Glissman Road through Springdale is not only a hassle but a big safety concern. A car has to practically get on Springdale Road to see if there are any oncoming cars or bicycle riders, the parking overflow on Springdale blocks the view. Another concern is the drinking of alcohol during the weddings and also on a weekly basis that happens at the Eden East eatery on Springdale Farms, the people who live on the farm also have to drive through our residential streets to get back to their homes, our house fence was once hit by an Eden East customer, weather alcohol was the reason isn't my main concern but knowing that similar events can happen in the future is my main concern, thankfully that was only a fence.

Parking issues are another concern. Parking during an event at Springdale Farms would cause anyone a headache, parking in front of our own house becomes impossible because there are cars parked all along our yard and across from our yard, in some instances parked directly in front of our gate, blocking us out of our own driveway. I would also go as far to say that not only do the residents in our street think parking is a hassle but also the customers and events visitors would agree that there are parking issues, if a business wants to bring in more customers they must also think of where parking will take place, it is irresponsible for Springdale Farms to simply let customers park where they wish to do so, we should not be forced to put cones in front of our home to ensure that our gates are not blocked. They should provide parking for customers at their own expense, not at the expense of their neighbors. Allan Elementary is not a parking lot for any business, Springdale Farms has continuously used school parking lot as their own, leaving trash on school property, causing wear and tear to school property—tax payers pay their dues to the city so that a school may be functional for students, faculty

and other school related activities, not for the use of weddings, we don't pay our taxes so that a business can use an AISD location as their own.

Noise levels, sleeping on the weekends and even during the week is sometimes at the mercy of the event happening at the farm, during weddings as is well known the guests want to dance, celebrate late into the evening, weather its live music or just prerecorded the audio the noise levels truly disrupt sleep. I go into work everyday at 4 AM, this includes Saturdays and some Sundays, for me to wait until an event is over by 11PM is simply not reasonable. I have lived in the neighborhood since 1986 and it was only until the farm started having weekly events that noise became unbearable. Calls to 311 have been in vain, during the late night hours nothing can be done to bring immediate help. One has to simply wait, and wait is what I have done multiple times... wait for the event to end so that I can catch some sleep.

I would like to close this by stating that I am not against farming, growing local organic foods is a great thing to do, we are not against urban farms, what I am against is having a farm that disrupts my daily activities. I ask that you consider the residents of the area who have called this place home for decades, we want a quiet place to sleep at night, we want to come and go into our street without having to figure out where we are going to park, we want to be able to walk through out neighborhood without having to find beer cans, wine bottles tossed in our grass. We want to feel safe at night when our daughters come home from work. I know that you too would not want to live next to an outdoor events farm. I ask you to not make me live next to such place. Thank you.

Unfortunately due to time constraints I was not able to stay for the public hearing held on October 28th, but I wanted to make sure to make these known to you and the rest of the commission. Thank you again.
