## Additional Backup Information

The draft ordinance amends the following Sections and Subsections:

1. Section 15-6-1 to clarify the definition of a "private collection service."
2. Section 15-6-41 to clarify that (1) City employees and (2) City's agents are not subject to the private collection service program.
3. Sections 15-6-11 and 15-6-13
  - a. to identify the premises that will be required to utilize City services and those that will be required to utilize private collection services; and
  - b. to authorize an individual to remove or transport solid waste generated from his or her residence using vehicles with one ton or less carrying capacity without a credit on his or her City of Austin account.
4. Section 15-6-54 to eliminate the requirement to put decals on each collection container. Verification will be accomplished through an auditing process. This change will reduce the number of permits that must be printed.
5. Subsections 15-6-56 (D), (E), and (F) to require licensed private collection service providers to pay license fees based on container use during a month rather than on a daily basis.

The changes to Sections 15-6-11 and 15-6-13 do not require a person in control of property to change service providers.
