You may also contact a neighborhood or environmental organization that has expressed an interest in an application affecting your neighborhood.

During a public hearing, the board or commission may postpone or continue an application's hearing to a later date, or recommend approval or denial of the application. If the board or commission announces a specific date and time for a postponement or continuation that is not later than 60 days from the announcement, no further notice will be mailed.

A board or commission's decision may be appealed by a person with standing to appeal, or an interested party that is identified as a person who can appeal the decision. The body holding a public hearing on an appeal will determine whether a person has standing to appeal the decision.

An interested party is defined as a person who is the applicant or record owner of the subject property, or who communicates an interest to a board or commission by:

- delivering a written statement to the board or commission before or during the public hearing that generally identifies the issues of concern (it may be delivered to the contact person listed on a notice); or
- appearing and speaking for the record at the public hearing;
- occupies a primary residence that is within 500 feet of the subject property or proposed development;
- or proposed development; or
- is an officer of an environmental or neighborhood organization that
 has an interest in or whose declared boundaries are within 500 feet of
 the subject property or proposed development.

A notice of appeal must be filed with the director of the responsible department no later than 10 days after the decision. An appeal form may be available from the responsible department.

Protest of Requested Variance for 1303 E. 2nd Street December 11, 2104

Dear Ms. Heldenfels:

I'm writing to formally protest my next-door neighbors' request for a variance. My husband and I live at 1305 E. 2nd Street, a home we've owned for ten years, where we live with our two children. Our neighbors live directly to our west at 1303 E. 2nd Street.

While we understand and appreciate our neighbors' desire to add on to their home, we feel that we can only support their plans if they stay within the city's guidelines, which we followed closely when we added on to our home in 2011. We're protesting their request for a variance because the proposed structure would impose an undue hardship on us. It would directly impact us in two ways: 1) reduce the resale value of our house, and 2) diminish our quality of life on a daily basis.

Before I explain how this addition would impact my family, however, I would like to explain how it would affect all of my neighbors. Should this request for a variance be granted, it would dramatically change the appearance of our streetscape and be the only instance of a shed roof on our otherwise historically-intact block. Doing so would open the door to more projects like this in the years to come, setting a precedent that would fundamentally alter one of our city's oldest neighborhoods. (We contest the claim on our neighbors' application to the city, under "Area Character," which states that the proposed addition would be "consistent with other construction in the area.")

I would also like to explain the unusual design that this variance would allow. Right now, the eastern wall of our neighbors' home—which faces our house—is one story tall, topped with a gabled roof that slopes down toward the lot lines. Were the variance to be granted, that wall would turn into a shear, two-story wall facing our house with a shed roof pitching west. Given how close our neighbors' home sits to ours—less than fourteen feet apart—this would affect us in a profound way.

How would this monolithic two-story structure affect us? Here are a few examples:

- Our kitchen's and dining room's sole windows are on our western wall. The
 natural light in those rooms will be vastly diminished, if not blocked all together.
- Our living room, which also has a western window, will be dramatically affected as well. We fear that its natural light will be completely obstructed by the carport that my neighbors intend to build right up to the property line.

• The very tall boundary tree that we share will, I estimate, have to be cut back by one-third to one-half to make way for this structure. This tree is quite old and lends character to our property, but we could lose it if it were cut that severely.

As you can see, this structure would affect our day-to-day life tremendously. Our home is a single-story house that was built in 1910. Our neighbors' plans, if executed, would forever change our house's historic character as well as its resale value.

Please note that our neighbors already built another two-story structure—a garage apartment with two floors of living space—in their back yard, directly abutting our property. If this variance is granted, and my neighbors are allowed to build this addition, it would be the <u>second</u> two-story building on this very small parcel of land.

We feel that the city prohibits overbuilding with good reason: to protect the character of Austin's older neighborhoods. When we added on to our home in 2011, we put a lot of thought and energy into making sure that our addition not only blended in seamlessly with our historic home, but with our neighborhood as well. We did not change the elevation, and we took great pains to make sure that the new portion of our home that extended into our back yard looked like the original, down to the same board and batten exterior. While we certainly don't expect everyone to do this, we do think it's reasonable to ask that our neighbors abide by the city's reasonable restrictions.

It brings me no joy to write this email. We think very highly of our neighbors. We only wish that our neighbors had approached us about their plans long ago, so that we could have tried to resolve these differences earlier in the process. But for the reasons stated above, we feel that we can't support their request for a variance.

Please note: At a further date, I will be submitting drawings that our architect is currently preparing that will show a rendering of our neighbors' proposed addition alongside our house. That way, you can visualize some of what I have described above.

The East Cesar Chavez Neighborhood Planning Team is writing to officially request postponement of the item to consider the request to increase the maximum amount of development permitted on a property from the greater of 0.4 to 1.0 floor-to-area ratio (required) to .49 to 1.0 floor-to-area ratio (requested) in order to add a 2nd story to the existing single family structure in a "SF-3-NP", Family Residence - Neighborhood Plan zoning district. (East Cesar Chavez).

We have as yet not had the opportunity to meet with the owner of this historic home and do not understand why the current zoning does not allow for a reasonable use of the property as a single family home when similar homes on the block have been used as single family homes for the past century. We would like to have the project team attend our next neighborhood meeting so we can learn directly why they feel they need this variance and why they have stated that receiving this variance would not change the character of the neighborhood even though it would mean changing the façade of this almost 100 year home nestled among similar homes on the block.

The East Cesar Chavez team has often welcomed redevelopment and we understand that to keep the neighborhood diverse and vibrant, there will be change. We would be happy to review the case and hear the owner's arguments; however, without meeting to understand the issues involved we would be forced to oppose any changes or variances from the official neighborhood plan that we have worked so hard to fashion. We meet regularly at 6:30 PM on the third Wednesday of every month at the Terrazas library. If the owner cannot meet at that time, we would be willing to consider an additional meeting at another more convenient time and place.

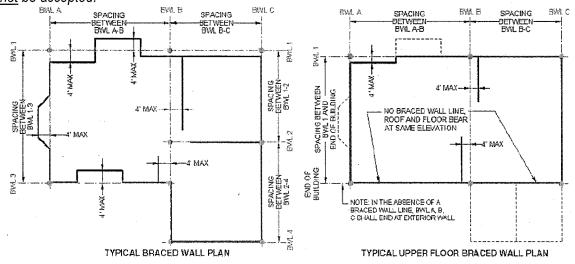

Hi Steve – sorry for my delayed response.

You can proceed to BOA 12/8, but you are asking for less than 25% FAR variance, so your case could also go to the RDCC (Residential Design Compatibility Commission), and they generally have lower standards for passing/approving the requests that come to them.

Or, you can postpone this case until you go to RDCC in Jan and see if the request gets approved by them 1^{st} then go to the Board if you're not successful at RDCC.

The difference between the Board's is you have to make an argument for physical hardship for the Board, but just design issues for RDCC. I don't know for sure that RDCC will grant, but I think the Board will ask if you went to them first.

Sorry I didn't see that you were less than 25% until I started to work on the notices, should have advised you to go to RDCC first back when you applied if I recognized it was less than 25% - I think the cover sheet just said FAR increase but I didn't investigate further and should have.

Daniel Word and Elaine Ramirez in Residential Review can get you and RDCC application packet (it may also be online at <u>austintexas.gov</u> if you click on development then search for that application).

If you want to proceed to Board 12/08 we have sent notices, posted signs and can do so – I just don't want it to feel like a long evening w/ a surprise at the end if the Board postpones you until you go to RDCC.

I hope this finds you well. I own a home at 1305 E. 2nd Street, which is next door to a house whose owners are requesting a variance from the McMansion Ordinance. The variance is being requested for 1303 E. 2nd Street. I strongly oppose this request for reasons that I will detail in a subsequent letter to the city. First, however, I'm hoping that you might be able to answer a few quick questions, either by phone or via email (whichever is easiest for you). The Board of Adjusters will be evaluating this application this coming Monday night.

My questions are as follows:

- --Is there a staff recommendation yet for this application?
- -- Do you know why this application is being evaluated by the BOA and not the RDCC?
- --Our Neighborhood Planning Team has not had time to review this application yet. Given that fact, will the BOA still consider this application on Monday or postpone?
- --The application lists no hardships. Does that mean that my neighbors will have difficulty obtaining the variance?
- --These same neighbors applied for a variance a little over a year ago. (I'm not sure if it was for the same plans, or different ones--I was not paying close attention.) I recall neighborhood opposition, and then a permit ultimately being granted. How might that impact this application? (If it's for the same plans, presumably a permit would be granted again?) --Is there anything you'd suggest that I do, such as commission a solar study (the new construction would block most of our natural light) or a tree study (there's an old, large tree between our property and the proposed construction)?

TYPE OF STRUCTURE

This is a one-story, wood frame, single family house with horizontal lap siding around the exterior. The foundation is a pier and beam system. The roof structure is conventionally framed in gable configurations. The lot is fairly level.

OBSERVATIONS

<u>Foundation</u>: Plans were presented at the site showing that a second-story addition is intended to be constructed. The upper floor system will be factory-built floor trusses, bearing on the exterior walls and the center wall running front to rear. The roof structure will be trusses or other structural members clear-spanning from exterior wall to exterior wall. I was asked to determine if the pier and beam foundation/floor system will support the imposed loads of the two-story addition or if the foundation needs to be strengthened.

The pier and beam foundation was constructed as follows:

1303 E. 2nd, Austin, TX

Piers – The piers were cast-in-place, spread footing piers and were properly constructed and in good condition.

Beams – The perimeter beams were 4x6 and the three interior beams were 4x4.

Floor Joists – The joists were 2x6 and were properly constructed and in good condition.

The floor inside the house was fairly level

The soil on this lot was sandy, rocky material

Drainage: The drainage patterns around the house appeared to be

satisfactory

Superstructure: The studs of the original house are 2x4 at twenty-four inches on center with 1x6 horizontal boards nailed to each side of the studs. The rear addition studs are sixteen inches on center.

CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Foundation: In order to support the additional imposed loads of a two-story addition, I recommend that the following remedial work be performed:

- (1) The perimeter beam should have a 2x8 #2 So. pine member nailed alongside the existing 4x6 with two 16d box nails at eight inches on center.
- (2) The center beam should be strengthened by adding a 2x8 along each side of the existing 4x4. The 2x8 should be fastened with 16d box nails at six inches on center.

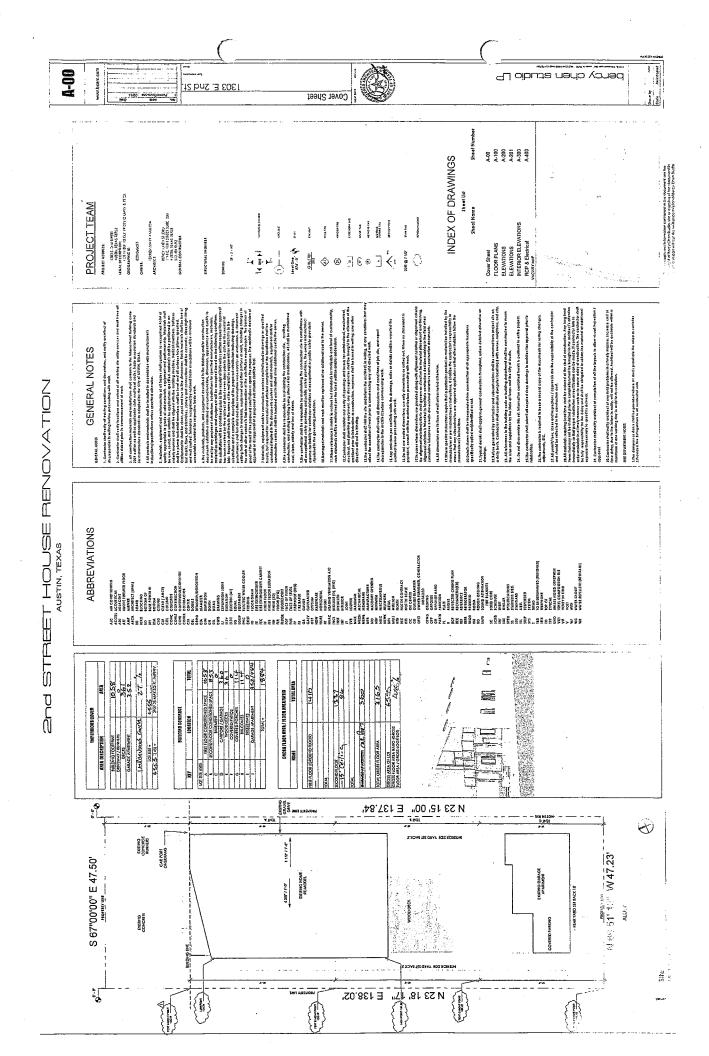
