This contract provides downloadable materials for Austin Public Library customers. Services and digital-content materials enable the library to lend downloadable audiobooks, eBooks, music, video, and other digital content through the Library's internet site. Downloadable video materials include documentaries, travelogues, feature films, and concerts which can be viewed by the same integrated desktop clients that support audiobooks and music titles. There are also downloadables with accessibility features for the blind and visually impaired. In addition to downloadable materials, this contract provides Library staff with Internet-accessible tools to control digital book-lending, manage access and use of materials, current circulation, and a variety of statistical reports. This is a very versatile tool available for a variety of ages and families for educational and recreational uses. It allows customers to check out material using a mobile device from virtually anywhere.

Overdrive was one of the first vendors to develop and make available a platform to download materials from libraries. Platforms are the delivery method which provides access to electronic content, including the management tool that a library uses to allow and control access to materials. Each platform is unique and vendor specific. Since inception or introduction of digital content by way of the Overdrive platform, use of downloadable materials has continued to rise and remains popular and in demand with customers.

The awareness for digital content among patrons has increased over the last several years. This awareness has impacted, in a positive manner, the circulation of materials. Patrons have been very receptive to the quick, easy, free, and user friendly access of digital materials available at the Austin Public Libraries (APL). The Library circulation statistics have shown that out of twenty branch libraries, the central library and the virtual library (digital content), the virtual library is currently ranked as the 4th highest circulation library in the APL system.

Overdrive, Inc. is APL's biggest and sole virtual library supplier, and Ingram Books is APL's biggest hard copy supplier. Without the increase to the contract, the Library will not be able to meet customer demands for digital content.

On March 3, 2011, Council approved the award of a contract with Overdrive, Inc. for a total contract amount not to exceed \$750,000. On June 7, 2012, Council approved increasing the base term of the contract to \$2,184,000 for a revised total contract amount not to exceed \$2,484,000.

This proposed recommended Council action is to approve Amendment No. 3 to increase the contract by \$1,500,000 for a revised total contract amount of \$3,984,000. The increase is needed due to the digital content consumption among patrons using our Library system. Additional funding has also been identified to develop the Central Library collection in anticipation of the new Library opening.
