PROPOSAL

Construct a two-story addition to the rear of the house; partially enclose the front porch.

PROJECT SPECIFICATIONS

The applicant proposes to construct a second-story addition to the rear of the house which will be side-gabled, with siding and roofing materials to match existing on the house. The applicant further proposes to lessen the depth of the front porch by approximately 8 feet to create an entrance foyer.


STANDARDS FOR REVIEW

The Old West Austin National Register Historic District has no design guidelines regarding additions and modifications to the front façade of contributing houses within the district. General design guidelines recommend that new additions be constructed at the rear of the house with a scale, massing, and fenestration pattern compatible with that on the existing house. General design principles also recommend against making any modifications to the front façade of a contributing structure.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Recommend that the applicant reconsider the change to the front of the house. The rear addition is consistent with the scale, massing, and details of the existing house.
