AFRICAN AMERICAN RESOURCE ADVISORY COMMISSION for Parental Empowerment Education Project

WHEREAS, the African American Resource Advisory Commission (the "Commission") is authorized by Austin City Code § 2-1-101 to advise the city council on issues related to the quality of life for the City's African American community; and

WHEREAS, the Commission is specifically authorized to recommend programs designed to alleviate any inequities that may confront African Americans in social, economic, and vocational pursuits, including (1) health care; (2) housing, including affordable housing, home ownership, and homelessness; (3) entertainment opportunities for professionals and students; (4) employment; and (5) cultural venues, including museums, theaters, art galleries, and music venues; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that students that drop out of school have a higher rate of health issues including HIV/AIDS; and

WHEREAS, the African American Parental Empowerment Education Project focuses on health care and education for African Americans; and

WHEREAS, the African American Parental Empowerment Education Project would help alleviate inequities in health care and education in the African American community by educating parents about the Texas Compulsory Attendance Laws:

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE AFRICAN AMERICAN RESOURCE ADVISORY COMMISSION HEREBY RECOMMENDS AS FOLLOWS:

That the City Council provide support for the African American Parental Empowerment Education Project, which focuses on the education of parents about the Texas Compulsory Attendance Laws and provide funding at the requested level of \$66,380.80.
