PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1904 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, wing-and-gable plan frame house with a partial-width shed-roofed independent porch on ornamental metal posts; single 1:1 non-historic vinyl windows; synthetic siding, including permastone at the principal entry.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1904; it does not appear on the 1900 Sanborn map. The first occupants of the house were John T. and Molly Rogers, who lived here until around 1909. John T. Rogers was a Missouri-born evangelist; the city directories list him as an elder in the Church of Christ. Earlier census reports show that John Rogers had previously been a farmer in Milam County, Texas.

Milton and Mathilde Vardell lived here from around 1909 to 1911. He was an Alabamaborn woodworker in a blacksmith shop; his son, Patrick, was a carpet layer for Scarbrough & Hicks, the predecessor to E.M. Scarbrough & Sons, the city's most prominent department store of the early 20th century.

The house then had a series of renters through the 1910s and 1920s, including Alex W. and Margaret Hamby, who lived here in the late 1920s. He was an ice dealer. Around 1930, the house purchased by John A. and Marie Innes, who lived here until around 1946. John A. Innes was a butcher; in the mid-1930s, they rented out a portion of the house; their tenants included a cement finisher, and attendants at Austin State Hospital.


Littlepage and Desta May Copeland owned and occupied the house in the late 1940s and early 1950s; he was a mail carrier for the Post Office. Around 1953, the house was purchased by Ricardo Guerrero, whose family lived here until the early 1980s. Ricardo Guerrero was a Mexican-born machinist at Austin Auto Supply; his son Ricardo also worked at Austin Auto Supply, and another son, Julian, who lived here in the 1970s, worked at Glastron Boat Company, Austin Auto Supply, and then at Texas Instruments. The house has been a rental property since the 1980s.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage the applicant to reconsider rehabilitation and re-use of this house, which is located on a relatively intact block on E. 2nd Street. The house has had some major modifications, which would generally disqualify it for landmark designation, but has a long history reflecting the history and architecture of this part of East Austin, and every effort to rehabilitate the house and return it to its historic appearance should be entertained prior to demolishing the structure. If the house cannot be rehabilitated, then staff recommends release of the permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center.

John T. and Molly Rogers (ca 1904 – ca. 1909)

The 1910 U.S. Census shows John T. and Molly M. Rogers at 1211 W. 6th Street in Austin. John T. Rogers was 66, had been born in Missouri, and was an evangelist minister. Molly M. Rogers was 43, had been born in Alabama, and had no occupation listed. This was the second marriage for both. They had a daughter, Lee Bertha Gildon, 24, who had been born in Texas, and was a stenographer for a mercantile agency. The 1880 U.S. Census shows John T. and Artimissa Rogers living in Milam County, Texas. John T. Rogers is listed as a 36-year old farmer. Artimissa Rogers was 32, had been born in Arkansas, and is listed as keeping house. They had 2 nephews living with them, March S. Foster, 8; and James Foster, 6.

Milton G. and Mathilde Vardell (ca. 1909-1911)

Milton G. and Mathilde R. Vardell are listed at this address in the 1910 U.S. Census. Milton G. Vardell was 67, had been born in Alabama, and was a woodworker in a blacksmith shop. Mathilde R. Vardell was 54, had been born in Alabama, and had no occupation listed. They had 2 children: Patrick M., 21, a carpet layer for a retail store; and Ida G., 16, who had no occupation listed. Both children had been born in Texas.

The 1920 U.S. Census shows Milton Vardell as a 78-year old widower living in the home of his daughter, Willie L. Shelton at 1400 Garden Street. Milton Vardell was employed at the State Capitol.

Smith was a truck driver for a sand and gravel company. The 1930 U.S> Census shows Will and Maggie Smith renting the house at 508 San Marcos Street. Both were 39; he was the manager of a coal and wood company.

Alex and Margaret Hamby (ca. 1923 – ca. 1929)

Alex and Margaret Hamby appear in the 1930 U.S. Census as the renters of the house at 109 Waller Street in Austin. Alex Hamby was 68, had been born in Texas, and was an ice dealer. Margaret Hamby was 65, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed.



Innes was 66, had been born in Germany, and had no occupation listed. Also at this address were Lester and Lorine Lamb, renters. Lester Lamb was 20, had been born in Texas, and was a construction laborer. Lorine Lamb was 19, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed.

John A. and Marie Innes appear in the 1930 U.S. Census as the owners of this house, which was worth \$2,200. John A. Innes was 60, had been born in Texas to Scottish-born parents, and was a meat cutter in a market. Marie Innes was 56, had been born in Germany and had no occupation listed. With them lived a nephew, Herschel Fuhrmann, 16, who had been born in Texas and was an apprentice in an electrical shop. The 1920 U.S. Census shows John A. and Marie A. Innes renting the house at 102 (?) W. 10th Street in Austin. John Innes was a butcher in a meat market; Marie Innes had no occupation listed.

Copeland as the renters of an apartment at 108 E. 14th Street. Both were 20, both had been born in Texas. L. Page Copeland was a mail carier on a rural route; Desta Copeland was the caretaker of an apartment house. The 1940 U.S. Census shows only Desta May Copeland, and she was living at 805 Neches Street. She was listed as married, and a demonstrator for a wholesale bakery.

His death certificate shows that he was in the masonry business and had been born in Mexico. He was living at this house at the time of his death.

Recitation of rosary was held on Thursday at 7:30 p.m. at the Mission Funeral Home Chapel.




