Authorize award and execution of a 12-month contract with CONVERGINT TECHNOLOGIES, LLC to provide maintenance and technical support for the security system at the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport in an amount not to exceed \$191,840, with four 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$197,260 for the first extension option, \$197,860 for the second extension option, \$198,460 for the third extension option, and \$199,060 for the fourth extension option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$984,480.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$111,907 is available in the Fiscal Year 2014-2015 Operating Budget of the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport. Funding for the remaining five months of the initial contract period and extension options are contingent upon availability in future budgets.

There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

MBE / WBE:

This contract will be awarded in compliance with City Code Chapter 2-9C Minority-Owned and Women-Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program. No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this solicitation.

Additional Backup Information

This contract is for services to provide software and hardware support for the security systems at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (ABIA). The vendor will provide software support, database maintenance, preventive maintenance, software licenses, on-site training, system monitoring, and troubleshooting for the security systems at the airport. These systems include items such as no fly lists and Transportation Security Administration (TSA) threat assessments. Also included is the access control system which ensures that only appropriate personnel have access to certain areas and a closed circuit television system used for monitoring throughout the ABIA campus including inside the terminal and the perimeter. These systems have been in place since the airport was constructed; however they are continually changed and upgraded with the newest technology and programs to ensure compliance with Federal Aviation Administration and TSA requirements. This new contract is replacing the current contract with Security Design Inc. DBA EO Integrated Systems Inc. which expires in May 2015. The new contract covers additional systems which were added to the previous contract and integrates all security system software into one maintenance/support contract.

The contract award amount includes an additional \$30,000 annually in contingency in the case additional work is needed above the standard maintenance and support to keep these critical systems operational. Any work would require the pre-approval from Aviation Department staff.

Software maintenance and support for some components of the airport security system are expired or are about to expire. This new contract will bring ABIA to a current support level with each manufacturer and enhance the on-site support staff. It will also provide advance level support of customizations, version upgrades and licensing required for these critical systems.
