














Our Vision












All youth in our community are prepared and supported to be:

- Ready for positive social and civic connections and engagement.



Needs / Trends

- The Travis County Child Poverty Rate has grown 4.3x the Travis County child population growth
- 36% of children & youth ages 5-17 speak a language other than English in the home
- Population shifts have made access to services more of a challenge for families with children
- Positive community-wide outcomes are being achieved, but there is still much more to do






What is being done?

- Over 200 organizations listed in Youth Services Mapping (YSM) system at <u>www.ysm-austin.org</u>
- More groups and agencies emphasizing comprehensive and holistic approaches to child & youth development
- More "collective impact" (systembuilding) efforts emerging to improve coordination of services





Key Considerations

- System-building efforts can optimize coordination, create efficiencies for families, and leverage resources
- Commonalities and points for coordination across system-building groups should be explored (e.g., data-sharing, referrals, etc.)
- Whole-family, culturally competent approaches are critical to achievement of sustained community-wide outcomes
