**Additional Backup Information**

On February 26, 2015, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 20150226-038 to initiate a code amendment to make adult-oriented businesses conditional rather than permitted uses in the Central business District (CBD) and Downtown Mixed Use (DMU) zoning categories. The purpose of this change is to allow for more public participation and more thoughtful consideration of how a proposed adult-oriented business use relates to the visions outlined in the Downtown Austin Plan, Imagine Austin, and other Council-adopted plans. Additionally, in the last 20 years, residential occupancy in CBD and DMU zoning districts has increased significantly. The resolution also directs the City Manager to consider adding language that prohibits “locating adult-oriented businesses on lots within 1,000 feet of a museum or library.”

The proposed amendment will make adult-oriented businesses a conditional use in the DMU and CBD zoning districts and will prohibit adult-oriented businesses on lots within 1,000 feet of a museum or library.
