National Fire Incident Reporting Remarks:

Responded to a report of trash being burned in the backyard at this location. Home under renovation with workers present. Homeowner was in back yard putting out with a garden hose a small burn pile that had been filled with some small brush and some smaller pieces of trim lumber. Advised the homeowner of the code re/ open fires inside of city limits. He pointed to a burn barrel located in the rear of the backyard but he too was advised against the use of that for the same reason. Homeowner stated he was somewhat embarrassed by our arrival as he had a roommate (later identified as FF Ashley Hamilton of E32A) who was his roommate. Fire was put out. While obtaining this information a person identifying themselves as a representative of the neighborhood association introduced himself to the crew and advised that this had been an ongoing problem with this resident. A check later of the RMS reports for this address showed a previous occurrence in 2008 and 2009.
