HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION APRIL 27, 2015 DEMOLITION AND RELOCATION PERMITS HDP-2015-0165 2200 AND 2204 RIO GRANDE STREET

PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1925 duplex (2200 Rio Grande Street, also known as 700 W. 22nd Street), and a ca. 1915 commercial building (2204 Rio Grande Street).

ARCHITECTURE

The ca. 1925 duplex at 2200 Rio Grande Street is a two-story, roughly rectangular-plan, hipped-roof brick-veneered building with a projecting hipped-roof section containing an open porch on the ground floor, and a framed sleeping porch on the second floor; single and paired 1:12 windows with 9:1 wooden screens.

The ca. 1915 commercial building at 2204 Rio Grande Street is a two-story, rectangularplan, pyramidal-roofed brick commercial building with a full-width inset porch on the ground floor supported by square, brick posts; single 1: fenestration.

RESEARCH

The ca. 1925 duplex at 2200 Rio Grande Street had some very long-term tenants, including Estelle Lewright, who lived here from around 1925 to around 1936. She had lived in Austin since 1885, and was one of the oldest graduates of the University of Missouri at the time of her death in 1953. She was active in many charitable and civic causes, including the Austin Woman's Club and the Texas Fine Arts Association. In the late 1920s, one of the units was rented by William R. Bishop, an associate judge in the Commission of Appeals. From the mid-1930s through the mid-1950s, William Carolos and nancy Raines rented one of the units. Raines was the director of the John C. Townes Bible Chair at the University of Texas, and was the director of the Baptist Student Center. A. LeRoy and Inez Nelson were also long-term tenants – from the mid-1940s through the late 1960s. LeRoy Nelson worked for the IRS.

The ca. 1915 commercial building at 2204 Rio Grande Street was built as a grocery store by George S. Heflybower, whose family operated the store until around 1940. George S. Heflybower passed away in 1936; his son, George B. Heflybower, had been a clerk in the store, and later its manager. The Heflybowers lived at 704 W. 22nd Street, which would have been behind the commercial building, although George B. Heflybower (the younger) lived on the premises for many years. The business passed to H. Laverne Smith, who operated a grocery business here in the early 1940s, then to Charles W. Flournoy, who operated the Rio Grande Grocery here until the mid-1950s. The building was then converted to a laundry, originally the Washerette No. 2, and later the Wash & Fold, both operated by W. Otto and Betty Mittag. In the 1980s, the building ws the home to Mike Hicks' advertising agency, Hixo, Inc.


STAFF COMMENTS

The duplex at 2200 Rio Grande is not listed in any City survey. The commercial building at 2204 Rio Grande Street is listed as a Priority 2 for research in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984).

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Postpone to May 18, 2015 to consider alternatives to demolition. While neither of these buildings probably qualify as individual landmarks, they have both been fixtures in the

West Campus neighborhood for many years, and careful consideration should be given to the prospects of rehabilitation and adaptive re-use of these properties. If the Commission votes to release the permits, then staff recommends the completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center prior to release of the permit.
