Additional Backup Information

Assumptions:

- The work of the Code Advisory Group is playing a significant and constructive role in the formulation of policy recommendations regarding CodeNEXT;
- Community feedback has been received to the effect that the Code Advisory Group should be expanded in order to allow for the appointment of additional members to expand the viewpoints on the Code Advisory Group;
- Having additional perspectives on the Code Advisory Group will increase the likelihood of success for CodeNEXT; and,
- The Code Advisory Group should be expanded to add additional geographic representation, experiences, expertise, diversity, and reach potentially including, but not limited to, neighborhoods and their associations, green planning and design, and small independent local business.

It is recommended that:

- The Planning and Neighborhoods Committee of the City Council meet to determine if there are perspectives not sufficiently represented on the current Code Advisory Group.
- The Planning and Neighborhoods Committee recommend to the Austin City Council the number of
 additional members that best provides for representation of diverse perspectives on the Code Advisory
 Group, and shall further recommend the names of Austin residents to fill the additional positions, if any.

The Planning and Neighborhoods Committee provide recommendations to the Council for the number of additional Code Advisory Group members, and potential appointees, if any, by May 1, 2015.
