Sister Cities International was created at President Eisenhower's 1956 White House summit on citizen diplomacy, where he envisioned a network that would be a champion for peace and prosperity by fostering bonds between people from different communities around the world.

Sister Cities International serves as a hub for institutional knowledge and best practices in the field of citizen diplomacy. With a mission "to promote peace through mutual respect, understanding, and cooperation — one individual, one community at a time," the mission of Sister Cities International is just as important today as it was when it was founded.

Sister Cities International's member programs focus on four main areas of exchange: arts and culture, youth and education, business and trade, and community development and technical exchange to connect citizens around the globe.

The City of Austin's Sister Cities Program fosters friendly relations and promotes understanding between the people of Austin and the citizens of our sister cities around the world. This program enhances Austin's presence in the community of nations.

### **Goals for the Austin Sister Cities Program:**

- To increase citizen-based collaboration and global cooperation at the municipal level
- To create and strengthen partnerships between U.S. and international communities
- To serve as the umbrella organization which guides the development of sister city relationships
- To increase the visibility, effectiveness, efficiency, and viability of Austin's sister city committees, thereby supporting their individual missions
