Motion by Casar, seconded by Pool, Troxclair abstains. The recommendation passes on vote of 2-0-0 with Vice Chair Houston not present.

Summary of Discussion

Item presented by CM Casar regarding raising the living minimum wages for City contractors and subcontractors across all categories (ie. professional services, construction, etc.). Item was not accompanied with written language for consideration, but was presented as a policy discussion. Initial policy recommendation for review was to raise the living wage for stated categories, and was verbally amended after public testimony to reflect the recommendation that the City Manager bring forward policy directions that the contracts include the city's living wage requirement and that the fiscal impact be evaluated as part of the budget process.

Chair Troxclair expressed concern regarding voting on an item without language to review. She expressed concern with having minimal information regarding the item and questioned if there had been a fiscal review to examine the impact such changes would have on contracting and the budget.

Houston had to exit the meeting for obligation in the district, but indicated that she held concerns regarding the financial and operational aspects of this item. She expressed wanting to meet with city staff on this item and would be interested in the public testimony.

Casar stated that the Transition Task Force determined no resolution is necessary to make a recommendation and that documents can trail the Committee's vote. Resolution or Ordinance language can be presented to full Council at later date.
