Texas Aggregates & Concrete Association Response to City-by-City Comparison

CITY	RESPONSE
Houston	The affirmative defense created in §30-16(5) allows construction related noise at a higher decibel limit than what would otherwise be allowed for all noise for the time specified. Subject to §§30-2 through 30-4, concrete can be installed 24 hours so long as it does not exceed the following decibel limit at the property line where the sound is received: 85 dB(A) between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. measured at a residential property line; 65 dB(A) between 8:01 p.m. and 10:00 p.m. beyond the residential property line on which the sound is generated; 58 dB(A) from 10:01 p.m. and 6:59 a.m. beyond the residential property line on which the sound is generated; and 68 dB(A) between 8:01 p.m. and 6:59 a.m. on the nonresidential property line on which the sound is generated. Thus, after-hours concrete installation is ALLOWED subject to these decibel limits.
Dallas	Agree with summary of §30-2(h) and that a permit may be issued to ALLOW for after-hours construction next to a residential use. Note that the prohibition to which the permit applies is only for <u>residential</u> uses and the Development Code limits the type of district where a residential use may be located. Thus, it appears that there is no prohibition when the construction activity is on or adjacent to a nonresidential use.
San Antonio	Agree with summary of §21-52(a)(6), but the intro in (a) states that the listed activities are only prohibited if done in such a manner "to annoy, to distress, or to disturb the quiet, comfort, or repose of a person of reasonable nervous sensibilities". Thus, construction activity is ALLOWED up to 80 db until 10:00 p.m. Sunday – Thursday and 11:00 p.m. Friday and Saturday, and can occur after these times if it does not create a noise nuisance. Further, there is a waiver mechanism in cases if urgent necessity, public safety, or public convenience, which ALLOWS construction activity in excess of this limit or after hours .
Fort Worth	The prohibition against construction after 8:00 p.m. applies only to work within 300 feet of an "occupied residential structure." "Residential" is defined in this section as "property zoned for residential use in accordance with the city's zoning ordinance." Construction work outside of this prohibition (i.e., nonresidential or farther than 300 feet from residential structure) is ALLOWED subject to the decibel limits in the general noise ordinance, which has different restrictions for residential zoning districts, non-residential and mixed-use and the Central Business District, Trinity Uptown and West 7 th Village.
