PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1937 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan, side-gabled frame house with a central, front-gabled overdoor hood with an open tympanum with ornamental pickets, and supported by triangular knee braces; single 1:1 fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1937 by Othello and Ara M. Routon, who lived here until around 1960. Othello Routon was a mechanic for Austin Transit, the predecessor to Capital Metro. The house appears to have been a rental unit since that time.


STAFF COMMENTS

The house does not appear in any City survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage rehabilitation and adaptive re-use if feasible, or postpone to the next regularly-scheduled meeting of the Commission to fully evaluate alternatives to demolition. While the house does not have the requisite architectural or historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark, it is a remarkably well-preserved example of a 1930s cottage that is representative of the architecture and social history of the neighborhood, and every consideration should be given to preserving this house rather than demolishing it. If the Commission votes to release the permit, then staff recommends the completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package, consisting of photographs of all elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history, for archiving at the Austin History Center, prior to release of the permit.



BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

Othelo and Ara M. Routon (ca. 1938 – ca. 1960)

O.C. and Ara Routon appear as the owners of this house in the 1940 U.S. Census. The house was worth \$2,000. O.C. Routon was 35, had been born in Texas, and was a mechanic for the city bus company. Ara Routon was 39, had been born in Texas, and had no occupation listed. They had a daughter, Alma, 8.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows O.C. and Ara Routon renting a duplex at 2203 Willow Street. O.C. Routon was a clerk in a grocery store; Ara Routon was a laundress.

O.C. Routon, age 82, died September 12, 1987.

He was an Austin resident for 55 years.

Survivors include wife, Ara M. Routon; daughter, Alma Sullivan; granddaughter, Vickie Denney; sister, Vern Roe.
