The Heritage Neighborhood Association met on August 3, 2015 and voted to send this letter. The neighborhood supports converting the specified daycare building, to the east of the main house at 808 W. 30th St., to residential use. However, we want to make sure that the variances do not alter the area's character and existing setback protections afforded to neighbors by code.

Therefore, we support the proposed variance(s) with the condition that they apply only to the existing structure east of the main house as it sits today. The variances should specify that no change is allowed to the current footprint, size, and height of the specified structure to the east of the main house. The variances do not apply to the structure to the west of the main house at 808 W. 30th St.
