## Taking a look at Work Force Housing Liberty Trails offers quality lifestyle for hardworking class

We have all been watching the construction of the beautiful Liberty Trails Townhomes just off 1869. Well, they are almost complete as well as almost completely leased. These, what would in the apartment industry be classified as "A" product rental housing, are available not only to the general public but also to those in the community who make less than Williamson County's median income level.

Liberty Trails Townhomes is developed, constructed and managed

by Picerne Development Corporation of Florida, whose primary focus is multifamily rental housing around the country as well as Puerto Rico. Picerne is dedicated to quality housing as well as its responsibility to the communities they build in and they remain in the communities they build in through the life of the development, from construction to management.
