If approved, funding will be provided for a one-year contract with PeopleFund. Services to be provided by PeopleFund include loan packaging and loan administration services to small businesses. PeopleFund will create or retain six permanent jobs through qualified program participants. The City has contracted with PeopleFund for over 15 years to provide these services.
