Zilker Café - Overview

The Barton Springs Pool/Zilker Park concession building (Zilker Café) was constructed circa 1960. Zilker Park is listed as a National Register Historic District and the 55-year old building has been modified over time, contributing to the historic character of the park and pool entrance.



Timeline

2002 to Present:

Concession operated by Rodriguez Concessions Inc.

Fall 2014:

Parks and Recreation Board recommended to the Parks Director not to extend the current contract's final option period.

Winter/Spring 2015:

- RFP Scope Drafted
- Public Input process for RFP has been Conducted
- Scope Finalized

Summer 2015:

- RFP Published
- Three Proposals Received
- Staff Recommendation Completed

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Public Input – Survey Results

Public Input:

- The public input process for the Barton Springs Food and Beverage concession was conducted in two phases: 1) online Survey Monkey consisting of seven questions and 2) an online conversation via SpeakUp Austin.
- The Survey Monkey questionnaire garnered 525 responses. Major Findings include:
 - 61% of respondents self identified as "not a customer":
 - 64% of noncustomers cited "unhealthy", "limited options" or "dietary restrictions" as reasons for not being a patron.
 - Of the 49% self identified as "customer":
 - 30% stated "convenience" as primary reason; only 14% identified "taste" as a reason.
 - Examples of other issues identified (positive and negative):
 - Lack of marketing
 - Snow cones, ice cream & lemonade are popular
 - Concern over bees

- Service mixed response with majority response stating "poor"
- Atmosphere mixed response ranging from "run down" to "funky"

Project Goals Stated in the RFP

- Nutrition and Sustainability;
- Pricing;
- Appearance;
- Customer Satisfaction;
- Environmental;
- Revenue; and
- Operations.



Zilker Café – RFP Results

Proposals:

The City received three proposals.

Evaluation:

 Staff finds the proposal submitted by Players Inc. best meets the expectations of the Parks and Recreation Department for the operation of the Barton Springs Food and Beverage Concession.

Considerations:

- The contract is to provide a turn-key operation for the concession. The City would not provide any financial assistance for its operation.
- The term is for one (1) four-year initial term and two (2) three-year option periods for total contract term of 10-years.
- Estimated revenues to the City are in excess of \$1.395 million (net) over tenyear contract.
- There would be a temporary disruption in service as the new contractor mobilizes to start-up operations.



Zilker Café - Action

PARD Staff Recommendation

The Parks and Recreation Board make a recommendation to the Austin City Council to authorize the negotiation and execution of a revenue contract with Players Inc. for the operation of the Barton Springs Food and Beverage Concession that operates within Zilker Park.
