Additional Backup Information						

This action amends the Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Service Agreement with the Austin Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC) in the amount of \$1,351,401. This funding will be made available to the Housing Trust Fund (HTF) derived from the sale of property approved by Council on 2/27/2014 (Ordinance No. 20140227-013 and 20140227-014).

Established on April 20, 2000, the HTF is dedicated to preserving and creating reasonably-priced housing in the City of Austin. If approved, this funding will be made available to housing and community development programs including the Housing Developer Assistance program. This program offers assistance to for-profit and non-profit developers to create affordable rental and ownership housing.

The Austin City Council created the AHFC in 1979 as a public non-profit corporation to facilitate the financing and development of affordable housing for low- and moderate-income residents. In addition to administering single-family and multi-family bond programs, the AHFC administers nearly all of the City's affordable housing programs. For FY 2015-2016, the AHFC will administer the Renter Assistance Program, the Homebuyer Assistance Program, the Homeowner Assistance Program, and the Housing Developer Assistance Program. The AHFC estimates it will assist approximately 1,533 households.
