Goals and objectives:

- Austin/Travis County HHSD, Environmental Health Services
 Division operates programs designed to promote and protect
 the public health.
- Minimizing the public's exposure to health and environmental hazards through community outreach, education and regulatory enforcement.

- Food Handler Registrations Significant revisions to Ch.
 10-3-34 regarding food handler registration based on the passage of SB 582.
 - Food Handler registration no longer required
 - Training still required.
 - Enforcement protocols.
 - "Volunteers" removed from the definition.

- Central Preparation Facilities Registration Process –
 Revisions and additions to Ch. 10-3 to include a new
 process and fee for the registration of mobile vending
 central preparation facilities.
 - Administrative fee for registration.
 - Must meet minimum requirements.
- Mobile Vending Minor additions to Ch. 10-3-93 adding water and wastewater tank sizing requirements.
 - Number one reason for the suspension of MV permits.
 - Critical food safety and environmental issue.

- Group Residence/Food Establishment Revision to Ch. 10-3-61 regarding the food establishment permitting requirement for group residential properties to provide consistency with the City Development Code.
- Food Establishment Restroom Requirements Changes to Ch. 10-3-122 regarding restroom requirements for food establishments related to TABC licensing and signage for single use restrooms for either sex.

- Temporary Food Event Definition change to Ch. 10-3-1 (15)
 allowing additional events and days per year operating as a
 temporary event.
- Temporary Food Booth Create a new definition in Ch. 10-3-1 to clarify what constitutes a temporary food booth.
- Temporary Food Operations The City of Austin fee schedule will be amended to allow single day/single booth events a reduced permit fee.

- Farmers Market Permit posting Clarification of Ch. 10-3-97
 (K) to require the original farmers market permit to be posted for consumers.
- Texas Food Establishment Rules Citation change in the City Code Ch. 10-3-2 (C) to coincide with the Texas Administrative Code change from 25 TAC Chapter 229 to 25 TAC Chapter 228.
