### 2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES -

Motion to approve action item made by Teddy McDaniel, III and seconded by Mike Rodriguez. Motion passed 6-0. (Commission Members Vicky Sepulveda and Luke Legate were absent at this vote.)

b) Vote to approve Commission By-Laws.

Motion to approve action item made by Paul Martin and seconded by Teddy McDaniel, III. Motion passed 6-0. (Commission Members Vicky Sepulveda and Luke Legate were absent at this vote.)

- c) Vote on a recommendation to City Council regarding the following:
  - i. Authorize award and execution of a 36-month contract with ASSOCIATED TIME PARKING & CONTROLS, to provide onsite maintenance, repair, and support services for the hardware, software, and associated peripherals for Aviation Department parking operations in an amount not to exceed \$2,157,688.25 with two (2) 24-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$1,264,812.50 for extension one (1) and \$1,292,622.50 for extension two (2) for a total contract amount not to exceed \$4,715,123.25.

Motion to approve action item made by Teddy McDaniel, III and seconded by Stephanie Trinh. Motion passed 6-0. (Commission Members Vicky Sepulveda and Luke Legate were absent at this vote.)

ii. Authorize execution of a contract with THYSSENKRUPP AIRPORT SYSTEMS, INC. to provide a mobile preconditioned air unit in an amount not to exceed \$204,577.

Motion to approve action item made by Mike Rodriguez and seconded by Paul Martin. Motion passed 6-0. (Commission Members Vicky Sepulveda and Luke Legate were absent at this vote.)

iii. Authorize execution of a contract with THYSSENKRUPP AIRPORT SYSTEMS, INC. to provide ground power units and a mobile trailer mounted ground power unit for mobile use in an amount not to exceed \$509,647.

Motion to approve action item made by Paul Martin and seconded by Teddy McDaniel, III. Motion passed 6-0. (Commission Members Vicky Sepulveda and Luke Legate were absent at this vote.)

### 6. OLD BUSINESS

a) Status of action items upon which the Commission has made a recommendation to Council.

Authorize award and execution of a 36-month requirements service contract with US SECURITY ASSOCIATES, INC., or another qualified offeror to Request For Proposal PAX0123, for security guard services for various City departments in an amount not to exceed \$4,725,000, with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$1,600,000 per option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$9,525,000. [Item went to Council on August 6, 2015 and passed.]

Authorize execution of a lease agreement with Highstar Capital IV, L.P. for up to 30 acres of land at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport to improve, operate, and maintain a limited services airport terminal for a 30-year term with two five-year extensions. [Item went to Council on August 27, 2015 and passed.]







The Aviation Department Information Systems Building 7355 located on the ABIA campus has undergone numerous upgrades over the past few years and currently houses a significant number of communications, security systems equipment and personnel that are vital to successful airport operations. This contract increases the reliability of the power supply to the building because relying on a single power feed from the electric utility is not ideal.

In cooperation with Austin Energy, this project will install a dual-power feed to the building and reduce the chance of a building power outage. To improve power reliability, this project will also improve the existing building emergency power systems, along with some minor building renovation work to better accommodate needs of building occupants.

This change order #3 is requested to modify the location of the generator and extension of ductbanks, conduit and grounding. This work is necessary to provide clearances required by Austin Energy and should resolve this contract to close-out.

If this project is delayed, there is a possibility of a power outage that may affect communications and security at the Austin-Bergstrom International Airport.

This change order is pending review by the City's Change Control Committee. 	Additional Backup Information

The Austin Bergstrom International Airport terminal is close to exceeding its service capacity of 11 million total annual passengers. In keeping with the recommendations of the 2003 and 2008 Austin Bergstrom International Airport Master Plan and Master Plan Phasing Projects, the current Terminal/Apron Expansion project expands the existing terminal to the east. This expansion will "balance" the terminal footprint and provide much needed space for the ever-expanding passenger and aircraft operational numbers. This terminal addition will be able to accommodate approximately 4 million additional passengers per year for a total of 15 million annual passengers — an increase of 27% that will provide a passenger level of service through 2025.

On February 13, 2014, the Construction Manager-At-Risk method of contracting was approved by Council. The Construction Manager-At-Risk method is a project delivery method where the City contracts with a Construction Manager to perform preconstruction and construction phase services and separately contracts with an architect/engineer to perform design services. Bringing the Construction Manager on board to provide preconstruction services during Preliminary Design phase helps ensure that a collaborative relationship exists with the Architect/Engineer, City, and Construction Manager from project design phases through construction phases.

On October 23, 2014, Hensel Phelps Construction Company was selected as the Construction Manager and following Council's authorization to negotiate and execute a contract, Hensel Phelps began collaborating with the City and the project Architect/Engineer, Gensler and Associates, on project scope and definition, preparation of budgets/estimates and project schedules, constructability reviews, construction trade outreach, and work packaging for solicitation of construction services.

A separate contract for design services with Gensler and Associates was approved by City Council in August 2014 at which time Gensler began Preliminary Design Services to include project scoping and project definition. Through this process, the apron and airside portions of the overall project was expanded to comply with Federal Aviation requirements and together with the terminal scoping and project definition, the Construction Cost Limitation for the project is \$276,000,000 plus \$13,000,000 Owner Contingency for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$289,000,000. The Construction Cost Limitation is not the contract amount, but rather a budget threshold for which the final contract amount shall not exceed without prior Council approval. The Construction Cost Limitation is an amount which includes all work performed by the Construction Manager consisting of Preconstruction Phase Services and Construction Phase Services including fees and construction contingencies.

The overall project is comprised of two major elements of work: 1) the apron expansion and associated work including all airside construction (deicing ponds, utilities, grading and paving, etc.) and; 2) the terminal building expansion and improvements.

Aviation Staff continues to work with the Federal Aviation Administration to apply for multiyear grants for the apron expansion and airside construction portion of the overall project. The process for accepting Federal Aviation Administration grant offers consists of accepting and executing the grant within a short timeframe. In an effort to make the federal funding process more efficient and to maximize the federal grant participation by the Federal Aviation Administration for the overall project, the project team (City of Austin, Gensler and Associates, and Hensel Phelps) anticipates the apron and terminal expansion and improvements project to be accomplished in five major phases by "Partial" Guaranteed Maximum Price Amendments to the contract. Each of the five designated phases of work within the overall project scope is referred to as "Partial" Guaranteed Maximum Price. Each of the five designated phases of work, ("Partial" Guaranteed Maximum Price) within the overall project scope will be combined to comprise the total sum of the Guaranteed Maximum Price.

- October 2015 First Guaranteed Maximum Price amendment ("Partial" Guaranteed Maximum Price 1
  Amendment) for demolition of the existing Regional Corrosion Control Facility complex and construction of the
  new storm water and deicing collection facility, terminal secure exit lane construction and temporary elevated
  walkway and passenger boarding bridges (equipment only).
- Spring 2016 Second Guaranteed Maximum Price amendment ("Partial" Guaranteed Maximum Price 2
   Amendment) for the Area 1 apron construction which includes east area apron paving, relocated utilities and
   removal of existing storm water/deicing pond.
- Late Summer/Fall 2016 Third Guaranteed Maximum Price amendment ("Partial" Guaranteed Maximum Price 3 Amendment) for the terminal expansion/improvements.
- Spring 2017 Fourth Guaranteed Maximum Price amendment ("Partial" Guaranteed Maximum Price 4
  Amendment) for Area 2 central apron construction.

- Spring 2018 Fifth and final Guaranteed Maximum Price amendment ("Partial" Guaranteed Maximum Price 5
   Amendment) for Area 3 west apron construction.
- Early 2019 Overall anticipated project completion.

This Council action is to request funding authorization for the construction cost limitation of \$276,000,000 plus \$13,000,000 Owner contingency, as well as authority to negotiate and execute future guaranteed maximum price amendments for the five phases of work identified above. Owner contingency is required for the expeditious processing of change orders or any unforeseen site condition encountered during the construction and renovation of the terminal and apron work. By separate Agenda Item, Council action is requested to authorize Gensler to continue with design development for the remaining apron and terminal expansion and improvement by authorizing additional funding.

This action item is time-sensitive and a delay in Council authorization will have significant impacts to the apron construction and terminal expansion and improvements for the overall project schedule. Federal funding and authorizations are tied to the proposed project schedule and work sequencing. The City anticipates issuing the first notice to proceed with the Work in the first Partial Guaranteed Maximum Price by mid-late October 2015.

The first work package for the demolition of the existing Regional Corrosion Control Facility complex and construction of the new storm water and deicing collection facility, terminal secure exit lane construction and temporary elevated walkway and passenger boarding bridges (equipment only) has an established Disadvantaged Business Enterprise goal of 9.65% for which the Construction Manager-at-Risk is required to meet or provide documentation detailing their Good Faith Efforts to meet the established goals. The proposed initial guaranteed maximum price proposal for this first work package reflects an overall Disadvantaged Business Enterprise participation exceeding 17.00%.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise subcontracting opportunities will also arise during all phases of construction for this project; however, the specific scopes and magnitude of the construction work cannot be determined until design has been sufficiently completed. Prior to entering into the phases of construction for this project, the City will establish Disadvantaged Business Enterprise goals and the Construction Manager will be required to submit a Compliance Plan meeting the construction goals or documentation detailing their Good Faith Efforts to meet the established goals. Prior to a Notice to Proceed being issued, the Small and Minority Business Resources Department will assess the performance of the Construction Manager in meeting the established goals.

This project is located in zip code 78719 (District 2) and is managed by the Public Works Department.

### Additional Backup Information

The Austin Bergstrom International Airport growth patterns have suggested that the Airport will need additional space for both passengers utilizing the terminal concourse and aircraft parking at the terminal gates. Currently, the Airport has 24 contact gates which have boarding bridges that service airplanes parked at each gate. The terminal concourse level, which consists of approximately 300,000 square feet, is nearing its service capacity.

The 2003 and 2008 Master Plan and Master Plan Phasing Projects recommended that the new space be added to the eastern end of the existing terminal facility. The expansion would add nine gates that will balance the terminal and provide approximately 70,000 square feet (a 23% increase) of new hold room space, concessions, restroom facilities, and concourse circulation space. It would also accommodate seven to eight additional aircraft parking spaces on the apron for both domestic and international airline operations. This near-term expansion will provide an approximate 30% increase in

aircraft operational capacity. The expanded terminal will accommodate approximately 4 million additional passengers per year for a total of 15 million annual passengers – an increase of 27%.

In August 2014, Gensler and Associates was approved by City Council to begin Preliminary Design Services to include project scoping and project definition for the Terminal Expansion and Terminal Improvements project.

In October 2014, Hensel Phelps Construction Company was selected as the Construction Manager-at-Risk responsible for preconstruction phase and construction phase services for the Terminal Expansion and Improvements Project. The terminal expansion will include gate expansion on the concourse level and apron level. The terminal improvements will consist of enhancements to the ticket lobby, roof inspections and replacements, electrical distribution infrastructure, airline radio infrastructure, terminal security system, bag claim level infrastructure, and terminal public address system replacement.

Through the process of project scoping and definition, the apron and airside portions of the overall project were expanded to comply with Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) requirements and to accommodate a request from the City's airline partners to add additional overnight aircraft parking positions, and a remote de-icing position. This amendment is necessary because of the additional scope and work created to comply with the FAA requirements. The Construction Cost Limitation for the Terminal Expansion and Improvements Project is anticipated plus \$13,000,000 Owner Contingency for a total not-to-exceed amount of \$289,000,000.

Aviation Staff continues to work with the Federal Aviation Administration to apply for grants for the apron expansion and airside construction portion of the overall project. The process for accepting Federal Aviation Administration grant offers consists of accepting and executing the grant within a short timeframe. In an effort to make the federal funding process more efficient and to maximize the federal grant participation by the Federal Aviation Administration for the overall project construction, the project team (City of Austin, Gensler and Associates, and Hensel Phelps) anticipates the apron and terminal expansion and improvements project to be accomplished in five major phases.

This request for Council authorization is for additional funding for all remaining design services required for the project. The work will be sequenced to allow on-going operations of the Airport Terminal Building for the duration of terminal expansion construction. The sequence of work contains the following separate Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP)'s for five distinct designated phases of the overall project as follows:

- Phase 1: Demolition of an unused Regional Corrosion Control Facility Building which must be removed before the project can begin and to allow for construction of the new Aircraft De-Icing Facility.
- Phase 2: Construction of Apron Expansion Area A to accommodate apron and taxiways suitable for large, international flight aircraft
- Phase 3: Construction of Apron Expansion Area B to extend the apron and taxiway to the east side of the new Terminal Building.
- Phase 4: Construction of Apron Expansion Area C, to extend the apron and taxiway to accommodate larger, international aircraft to taxi to the new Terminal Expansion Building.
- Phase 5: Construction of the Terminal Expansion project, and multiple improvement sub-projects inside the Existing Terminal Building.

Participation goals stated in the original Request for Qualification (RFQ) solicitation were 1.90% African American; 9.00% Hispanic; 4.90% Native/Asian; and 15.80% WBE. The participation goals for the additional funding will remain the same.

This amendment is pending review by the City's Change Control Committee. The Change Control Committee was established to comply with Council Resolution No. 20120126-048, which required the establishment of consistent criteria and process to evaluate contractual changes for all contracts administered by the Contract Management Department. The Change Control Committee is comprised of management-level subject matter experts.

## Additional Backup Information

The Texas Department of Transportation (TXDOT) plans to design and construct toll lanes on SH71 from Presidential Boulevard to a point just east of SH 130 in Austin, along with the realignment of FM 973 from just south of the Colorado River to a point approximately 0.5 mile south of the current SH 71/FM 973 intersection, referred to as the "SH 71 Express Project" (Project). 	Additional Backup Information

The continued and anticipated growth of Austin Bergstrom International Airport operations has necessitated the need for additional close-in public parking and terminal leasing space for the airlines and its customers at Austin Bergstrom International Airport.

Currently there are approximately 13,000 public parking spaces at Austin Bergstrom International Airport, and approximately 3,000 of those spaces are garage parking spaces. During busy periods, the public garage at Austin Bergstrom International Airport reaches capacity and is closed; patrons are then directed to remote surface lots from which they can ride a bus to/from the Terminal Building. The garage was closed to patrons due to full capacity 143 times during the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015. In addition, Aviation Administration staff occupy approximately 12,000 square feet of

office space in the Terminal.

The Aviation Department is proposing to build a new public parking garage with options for including an administrative office building. The new parking garage is forecasted to help alleviate the close-in parking capacity issues beyond 2025. Moving the administration offices from the mezzanine and other levels of the airport Terminal Building to the new administrative office site could free up space for revenue-generating lease space for airlines and their customers.

The selected consultant will work concurrently with a Construction Manager-at-Risk and City staff to design a new 4,000 to 5,000-space public paid parking garage and develop options to build an Austin Bergstrom International Airport administration office building. If feasible, the firm will design the Austin Bergstrom International Airport Administration Building. The proposed site of the new structure is the current Parking Lot "A" (map enclosed) which is adjacent to the existing Austin Bergstrom International Airport Parking Garage and the new Consolidated Rental Car Facility.

The scope of work shall include space planning of existing Department of Aviation offices within the Terminal Building, the Planning and Engineering building and other Austin Bergstrom International Airport buildings as required to determine feasibility of moving into the new Administration Building. The selected firm shall provide financial feasibility expertise to help investigate funding for the construction, potential revenue generation and to help determine the final scope for the project.

This authorization provides for funding of services related to design services. This request allows for the development of an agreement with the qualified responder that Council selects. If the City is unsuccessful in negotiating a satisfactory agreement with the selected responder, negotiations will cease with that provider. Staff will return to Council so that Council may select another qualified responder and authorize contract negotiations with that provider.

Participation subgoals stated in the solicitation were 1.9% African American; 9.00% Hispanic; 4.90% Native/Asian; 15.80% WBE. The recommended firm provided a MBE/WBE Compliance Plan that met the goals of the solicitation and was approved by the Small and Minority Business Resources Department. The alternate firm provided a MBE/WBE Compliance Plan that met the goals and was approved by the Small and Minority Business Resources Department. Notification of issuance of a Request for Qualifications was issued on June 9, 2015 through the City's Vendor Connection web portal, which resulted in 3076 firms receiving notice. The solicitation was obtained by 168 firms and 8 submitted qualification statements. None of the firms were certified MBE/WBE firms. Of the 8 firms evaluated, 2 firms were short-listed and interviewed. Interviewing of the short-listed firms resulted in the following recommendation.
